## **2022 NACD Poster Contest**

The Vermillion Co. Poster Contest is open to kindergarten through twelfth grade students. Artwork entered into the competition will be judged at the local level. A winner and runner-up will be chosen in each grade category and announced at the 2020 Vermillion Co 4-H Fair. Winners will receive \$20 and runners-up will receive \$10 from the Vermillion Co. Conservation Partners Fund.

## **Contest Rules**

- Any media may be used, including paint, crayon, colored pencil, charcoal, stickers, paper, or other materials.
- The SWCD will provide poster board to any student who wished to participate.
- All posters must be created by an individual student, rather than a team of students.
  Entry must be contestant's original creation and may not be traced from photographs or other artists' published works.
- Student's name **SHOULD NOT** appear on the front of the poster.
- The 2022 Stewardship theme "Healthy Soils: Healthy Life" must be included on the front side of each poster submission to be eligible.
- Each entry for the national contest must be submitted to NACD with an **entry form** to be eligible for judging. The form can be downloaded from the SWCD website and must be completed and signed by a parent or guardian.
- <u>Digital posters</u> (photographs or scanned copies of the hand drawn posters in a JPEG format) will be accepted <u>for the 2022 county contest</u>. Photographs must be clear and well framed (*clear edges on all four sides of poster*).
- Digital entries should be saved as a .jpeg file and named in the following format: lastname firstname grade.jpeg
- Although younger students will most likely receive help in planning from parents or teachers, NACD encourages each student to do their own work. Note: Entries with student handwriting and coloring will score better than those designed, drawn, and colored by adult assistance or created on a computer.
- Entries are to be emailed to <u>vcpostercontest@gmail.com</u> or dropped off at the SWCD office by 11:59 pm on May 11, 2022. Posters received after this date and time will not be judged.

## **Poster Evaluations**

National Poster Contest entries are reviewed based on the following criteria:

- Conservation message (50 percent) (Poster uses correct theme)
- Visual effectiveness (30 percent)
- Originality (10 percent) and
- Universal appeal (10 percent)
