The Philippine Olympians Association History


The Philippine Olympians Association (POA) is an organization representing all Filipino Olympians. It was organized in 2002. Filipinos who competed in the Olympics are automatic regular members of the POA. Other members of Olympics delegation may be considered for associate membership in the POA.

The POA is officially recognized by the PHILIPPINE OLYMPIC COMMITTEE (POC) and is affiliated with the World

OLYMPIANS ASSOCIATION (WOA). The WOA was created in 1994 and is recognized by the INTERNATIONAL OLYMPIC COMMITTEE (IOC) as the representative body of over 100,000 Olympians all over the world.

The Philippines first participated in the Olympics in Amsterdam in 1928. Since then 389 Filipino Olympians have participated in 22 sports.

Once an Olympian – always an Olympian. Let us not forget that. In a moment in our lives, we have achieved the apex of excellence in our chosen sports.

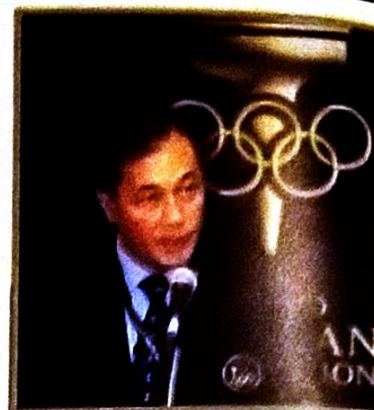

The Olympics originated in Ancient Greece and the Greek ideal of excellence was known as Arête. It was for this reason that the Philippine Olympians Association named its recognition symbol as the Arête Award. To further emphasize our commitment to excellence we have decided to name our newsletter Arête.

Greece too was the stomping grounds of the great philosophers Socrates and Plato. It is not surprising therefore that the Olympic Movement is explicitly guided by a philosophy of life known as Olympism. The Fundamental Principles of Olympism includes elements related to both personal and social ethics. "An Olympic philosophy of Life recognizes and urges respect for ethical principles". As Olympians we were exposed to important values such as friendship, fairness, and solidarity.

It is not fame, fortune, or even victory that is the ultimate end or goal of the Olympics. Rather, individual development and harmony of society are the goals. The motto of the World Olympians Association to which we are all affiliated is "An Olympian is an Olympian forever". It is intended to remind us that even after our sports careers, we must continue to live by the values we developed as athletes and to always be conscious of and adhere to the principles of Olympism.

The Fourth Pillar of the Olympic Movement

The WOA is the newest and most recognized pillar in the Olympic construct. It has taken over one hundred years for sport to mature from a privileged pastime into a cohesive school of thought. Olympism is a philosophy whereby the Olympian represents the culmination of its virtues and embodiment of its spirit.

There is no way to attain the title of Olympian except through sacrifice and declaration. The title Olympian cannot be bought, bartered, or gifted in any way shape or form. It is said that the WOA is perhaps the most exclusive club in the world because of its strict adherence to fair play, ethical conduct, and peak performances required to earn membership. An athlete becomes an Olympian at the moment he or she is accredited at the Olympic Games. Regardless of results—win,

lose or draw, every athlete marches out of the Olympic stadium a champion. WOA membership requires no fee, application or obligation. It is a lifetime honor bestowed on those who merit the title.

The WOA provides, as the fourth of the Olympic Movement, the human face that inspires dreams, motivates action and produces success.

Our Mission

The mission of the WOA is clear: to engage the over 100,000 Olympians worldwide and assist them in extolling the virtues of the Olympic Movement within their cities, regions, countries and around the planet. The organization exists solely for the purpose of ensuring that the flame remains bright during the lapse between Games and in the everyday lives of all Olympians.

In order to achieve maximum effectiveness the WOA has structured its mission in two equal and interlocking "hand pieces". This involves internal and external components whereby the WOA empowers Olympians to build local alumni programs. This forms a vehicle to contribute to the welfare of their fellow citizens.

Internal mission: The fraternal component entails a series of gestures and activities to improve communications among the alumni and cement true Olympian friendships. Typical programs are based on holding regular meetings, hosting social gatherings, producing communications, and obtaining special benefits and recognition for Olympians.

External mission: The community service component entails a series of engagement and interactions to support the needs of non-Olympians. Typical programs are based on volunteer service in areas that touch every citizen. These are often school visits, health fairs or environmental projects where the public can share the Olympians energy to achieve a set of collective goals.

Each of these elements represents a vital link in the short and long term responsibilities of sport as a social phenomenon. In balance, these components of the WOA mission not only perpetuate the practice of physical sporting contents, but also proliferate the popularity of an ideal "mens sana en corpora sano" (healthy mind, healthy body).

The Founding Principles



As defined by Baron Pierre de Coubertin, founder of the modern Olympic Games, "The important aspect in sport is not to win, but to have participated..." The World Olympians Association (WOA) is an independent global organization formed for the purpose of representing all Olympians and furthering the aims and ideals of the Olympic Movement.

President Juan Antonio Samaranch inspired the creation of the WOA during the Congress of Unity and Centennial Session of the International Olympic Committee held in Paris in 1994. A year later in 1995 the World Olympians Association was recognized under the Olympic Character as the fourth pillar of the Olympic community entrusted to oversee the fraternal order of athletes who have risen to the highest level in sports. In doing so, the WOA pledged to work in harmony with the IOC, and its athletes Commission, in the preparations of Olympic athletes as ambassadors of goodwill and clean living across the globe.

VISION

The WOA is characterized by the image and attitude of its members: the Olympians. Each Olympian's work ethic and commitments to excellence in sports translate into everyday life. The WOA has based its existence on these same beliefs that distinguish Olympians from mere sportsmen, and excellence from visiting.

The most basic principles and purpose of the WOA is "To Unite Olympians." This is a broad vision that encompasses a dual mission of fraternity and community service. With over 100,000 Olympians in 200 nations the WOA has the ability to address any challenge desired. Olympians are not only great athletes; they are doctors, lawyers, bankers, bakers, mechanics, merchants, ministers, monarchs, plumbers, policemen, politicians, parents, and teachers. Olympians come from all regions, races and cultures. Olympians can be found everywhere a dream to succeed flourishes, United, Olympians can help enhance the quality of life around the world.

Through the skills and training that Olympians have gained in sport they are bounded together in a special spirit of fellowship formed on the field of play. Olympians are keenly conscious of their status in society and aware of the needs of others. These traits make Olympians uniquely suited to serve the communities in which they live.

The WOA seeks to fulfill the vision of uniting Olympians in a common cause. It is through active role modeling that Olympians can show others how to become the best they can be, whether in sport or any other road they choose in life.

IOC Athlete Career Program: Philippines

The Philippine Olympians Association, in support to the Philippine Olympic Committee, introduced the POC Athletes Career Program. The Program seeks to help elite Filipino athletes, including Olympians prepare for careers after their sports years.

The First seminar was held last February 7-8, 2012, at the Philsports Complex and was conducted by representative Patrick Glennon of Adecco. Adecco is the partner of the IOC Athletes Commission for the IOC Athletes Career Program. A second seminar was held in June 2013. The local facilitator is Dr. Benjamin Espiritu, who heads the Philippine Olympic Academy.

- Life Skills
- Employment

It has been designed for you, the athlete, based on advice from elite athletes, coaches, NOCs and experts from around the world.

The programme consists of practical information, tips and support which any athlete can access on the special web site section: www.olympic.org/iocacp

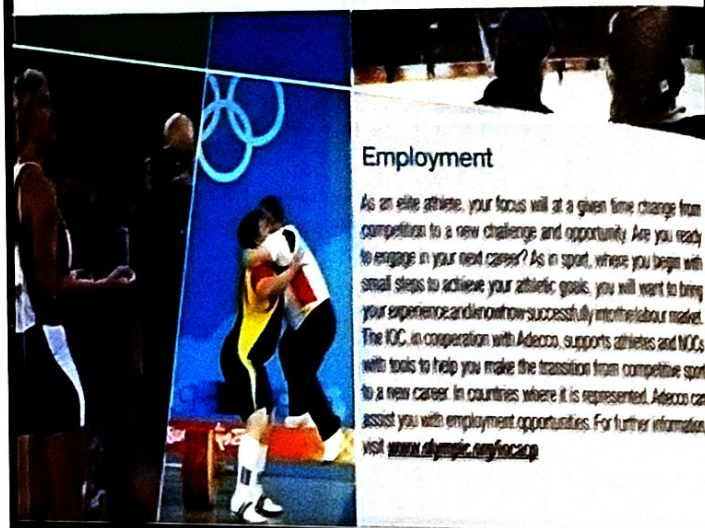
On a national and sporting level, some NOCs and International Federations have implemented programmes to assist you.

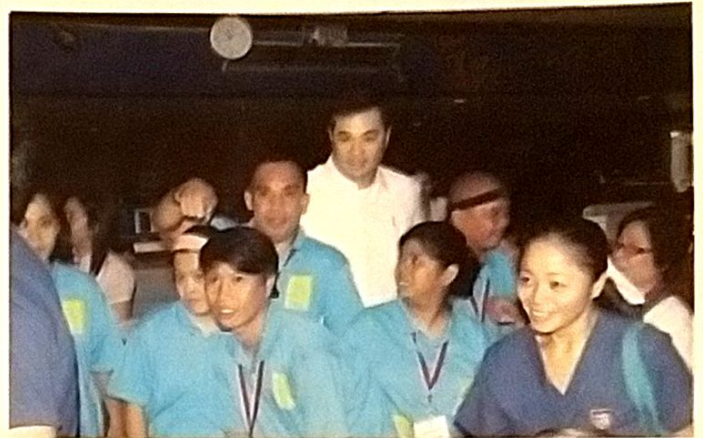

Arête

Translated as virtue, ARÊTE actually means closer to "being the best you can be" or "reaching your highest potential". ARÊTE therefore is VIRTUE. It is EXCELLENCE. It is GOODNESS.

The Olympics traces its beginning to the ancient Greek religious festival honoring Zeus, the chief Greek God. It was then the biggest event in the world. Ancient athletes competed as individuals, not as national teams as in the modern Olympics. The emphasis on individual athletic achievement through public competition was related to the Greek ideal of excellence, called ARÊTE.

This was the most articulated value in Greek culture. Translated as virtue, ARÊTE actually means closer to "being the best you can be" or "reaching your highest potential". Arête therefore is Virtue. It is Excellence. It is Goodness.

As an organization representing excellence in sports, the Philippine Olympians Association recognizes individuals and organizations or institutions that epitomize virtue, excellence, and goodness through the ARÊTE Award.

In 2009, the Philippine Olympians Association honored **Rafael "Paeng" Nepomuceno** and the Colgate Sports Foundation with the Arete Awards. Nepomuceno was recognized for his outstanding success as a Bowling Champion and for living a life following the values of Olympism.

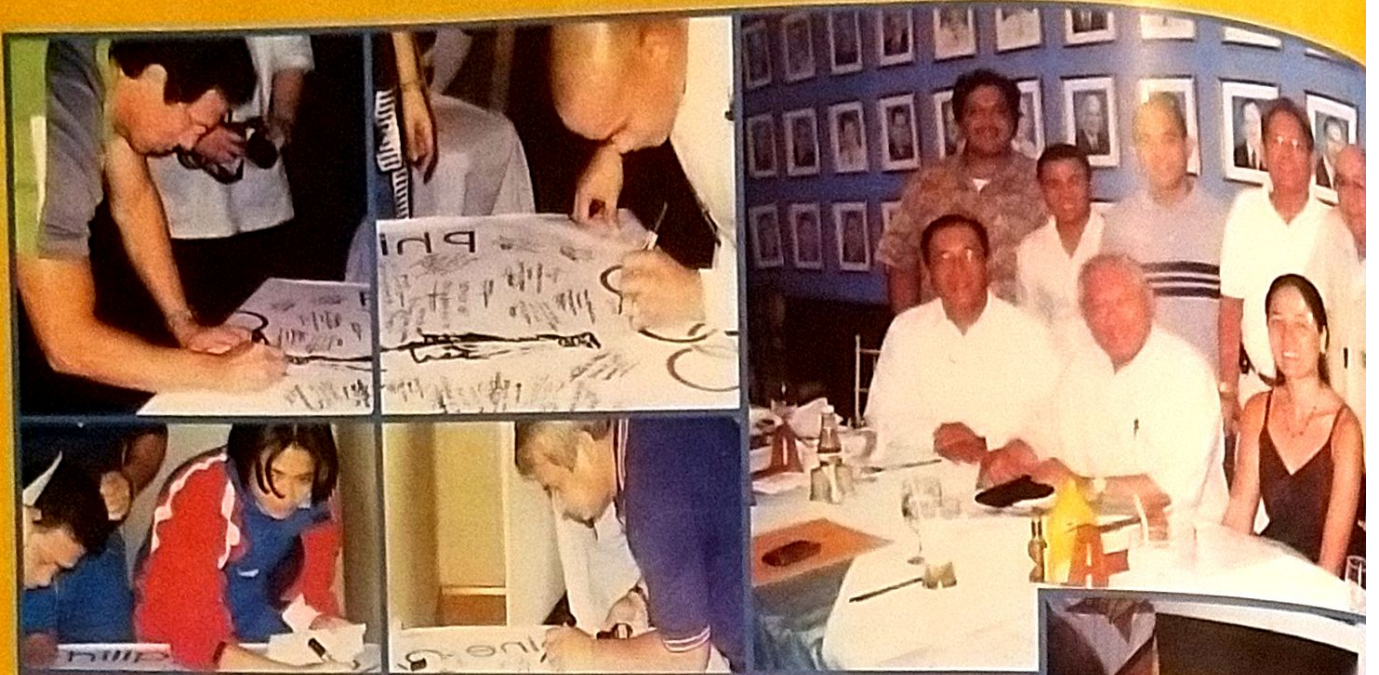


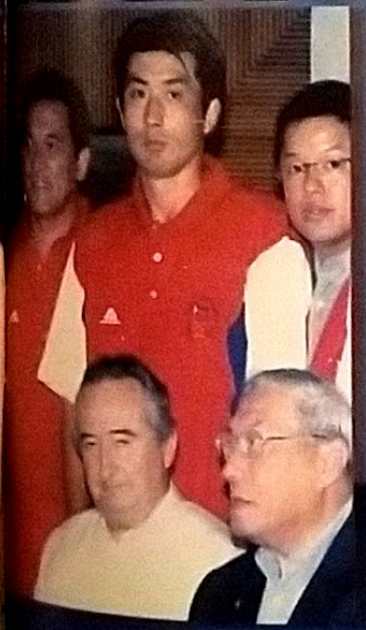
The first Arête awards were given to **Celso Dayrit**, former president of the Philippine Olympic Committee, who initiated the formation of the POA and in recognition of his sports leadership accomplishments, and to the **Nestlé Milo Organization** in recognition of their support for sports development specially among the youth. Every summer Milo sponsors simultaneous sports camps in various sports with thousands of young people in participation. Both awards were given in 2005.

The Colgate Sports Foundation was recognized for its contribution to the development of sports in the country, particularly for its donation of many sports facilities all over.



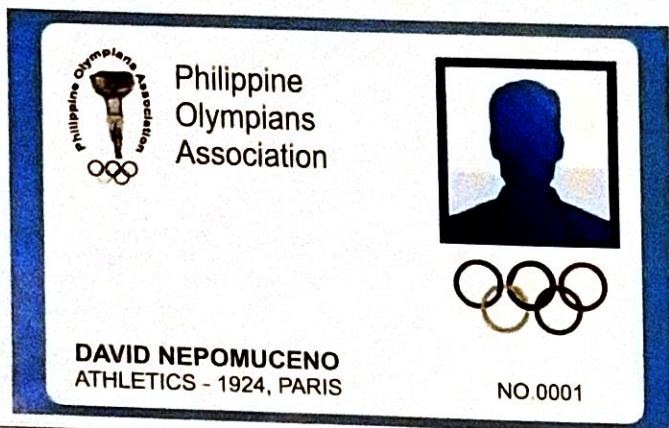

ROSTER OF FILIPINO OLYMPIANS

Every Filipino Olympian is assigned a permanent number and an ID which shows details of Olympic participation and the assigned number is also provided every Olympian. The honor of being the first Olympian is given to **David Nepomuceno**, Athletics. He was a sprinter and the sole representative of the Philippines to the 1924 Summer Olympics in Paris, France. In 1925, Nepomuceno ran the 100 meters in only two-tenths of a second short of the then-world record.



The privileges as provided by law is quoted at the back of the ID. "The bearer of this card is a Filipino Olympian entitled to privileges stipulated in RA 9064 or the Sports Benefits and Incentives Act of 2001".

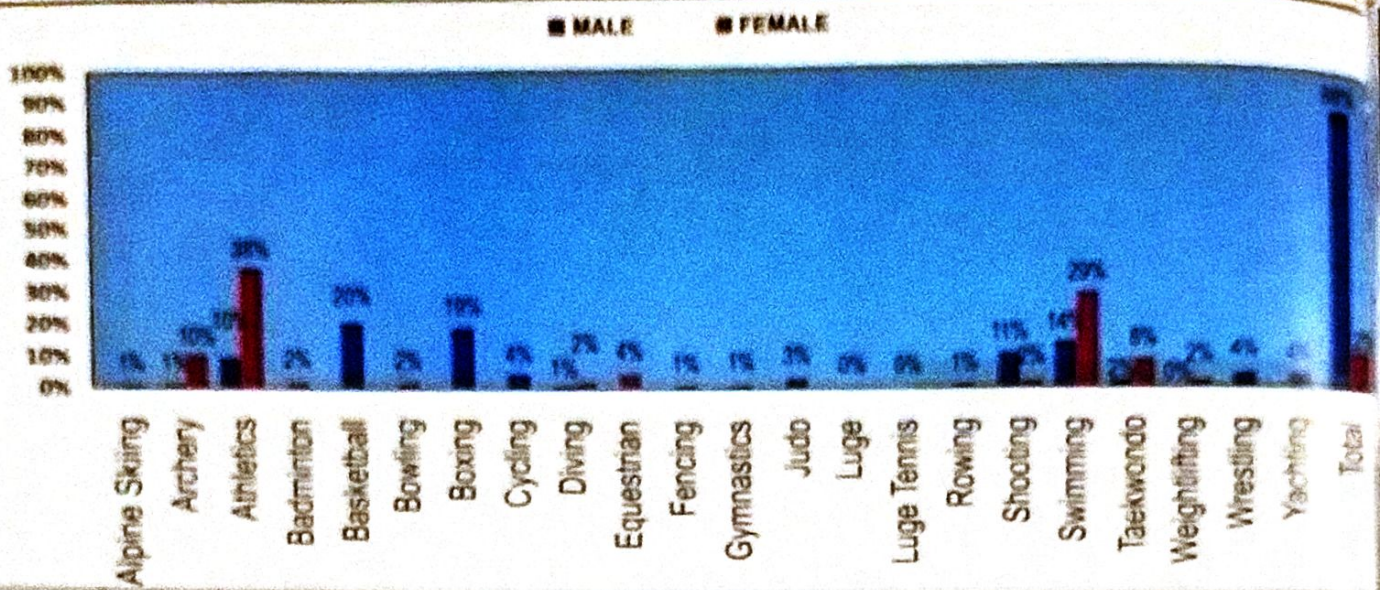
