### PSR CORNER

#### WHY DO I HAVE TO GO TO MASS?

We all have been asked that question by someone or even by ourselves at times. It's how we answer that question that will leave a lasting impact.

Sometimes, as a parent, I want to tell my children that they have to go because "that's what the Church says we should do," or "we are a family and that's what we do." Neither one of those answers gets anyone excited about going; it does make mass feel like an obligation, which it is not. Instead, here are some excellent answers as to why we go to mass that not only feel good but help us to develop our relationship with God:

We receive support from our faith community. Whether we attend our parish or another, we, as Catholics, have a faith community that spans the entire globe. When we come together and join our prayers, songs of praise, and expressions of thanksgiving, it helps us realize that we are not alone on our faith journey.

We receive forgiveness. At the beginning of Mass, we acknowledge God and one another that we have made mistakes and are sorry for them. Did you know that striking our heart three times has a significant meaning? It is an outward sign that we know we have sinned and are sorrowful and repentant, which is how we receive God's healing forgiveness.

**We receive guidance.** The readings and the homily offer us spiritual guidance on how to live our lives as Catholics.

**We pray.** The Mass is the most beautiful prayer we have in our faith; from start to finish, we are in prayer with God. We pray for ourselves and others, we make an offering to God, become one with Him in communion, and listen to His word.

**We forgive.** When we join in the Lord's Prayer, we promise God that we will forgive those who have trespassed against us, in that we act like Jesus.

We witness a miracle. We can witness simple ingredients of bread and wine turned into the body, blood, soul, and divinity of Christ; when we receive Him, we are strengthened in body and spirit. As Catholics, this is not symbolic for us.

We share in the peace of Christ. When we extend our hands to others, we are sharing in the peace that Christ wanted for the world; we are called to extend that peace beyond the Mass as well.

We receive a special blessing. It's easy to slip out after communion and beat the parking lot congestion, but what we miss out on is the final blessing. The peace of the Lord is bestowed upon us, and we are called to go out into the world to spread the peace and love that Christ gives to us.

When we look at all the gifts the Mass brings to us, doesn't it change the answer we give to the 'why' question?
