This weekend's readings invite us to live a life of active faith, a faith that's not merely spoken on Sundays, but integrated into our daily actions, priorities, and choices. The theme challenges us to ask: Is our faith truly part of our life—or just a part of our schedule?

Our modern lives are full of distractions and noise. But Jesus invites us to trust in the Father's care, to let go of anxiety, and to "sell your possessions and give to the poor"—not just metaphorically, but to truly detach from false securities and live lives rooted in heaven.

To integrate our faith is to live as though Christ is already among us-because He is. Let us prepare not just for His second coming, but for His daily coming in our hearts, our neighbor's needs, and the moments that test our trust. Amen.

Jesus died at 33. The human spine has 33 vertebrae. The same structure that holds us up is the same number of years He held this Earth.
