Tri-Parish Jubilee year Pilgrimage to the Cathedral: As we approach the end of the Jubilee year 2025, I invite you to join the Tri-Parish Pilgrimage to the Cathedral on Sun, Sept 28. Please meet at the Cathedral at 2:30pm. This is a spiritual opportunity to obtain Plenary Indulgence, which is the full remission of the temporal punishment due to sin.

To receive the plenary indulgence during the pilgrimage, the following conditions must be met:

- Make a pilgrimage to a designated Holy Door (in our case, the Cathedral of the Diocese)
- 2. Go to Confession (during the pilgrimage or closer to it, before or after the pilgrimage).
- Receive Holy Communion (preferably on the day of the pilgrimage).
- Pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, which can be done with one Our Father, one Hail Mary, and one Glory Be
- Be free from all attachment to sin, even venial sin. This can be difficult, but it means sincerely trying to live in God's grace with a pure heart.

I sincerely encourage you and your loved ones to sign up and join us on this holy journey to be spiritually renewed.
