Series on the Mass - Week 4 The Preparation of the Gifts: Offering Ourselves to God

Today we come to the next part of the Mass: the **Preparation** of the Gifts, often called the Offertory. This is a moment that can easily slip by unnoticed, but it is full of meaning.

During this time, members of the congregation bring forward the gifts of bread & wine, along with our offerings for the needs of the Church & the poor. At first glance, it might seem like a simple practical step-we need bread & wine for the Eucharist, & we take up a collection to keep the parish running. But in reality, something far deeper is happening here.

The bread & wine represent more than just food & drink. They symbolize our whole lives-our work, our joys, our struggles, our prayers, even our weaknesses. Think about it: bread is made from many grains of wheat, crushed & ground together. Wine is made from many grapes, pressed & poured out. In the same way, all of us bring the pieces of our lives together & place them on the altar.

When the priest lifts the bread & prays, "Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation...", he is really offering us to God. We are saying: "Lord, here I am. Take my life, my work, my family, my hopes. Transform them." And what does God do? He takes these simple gifts of bread & wine-& through the Eucharistic Prayer, He transforms them into the Body & Blood of Christ. If God can transform bread & wine, He can **transform** us too.

This is also why **the collection** matters. When we place our offering in the basket, it is not just about money. It is a sign of our gratitude & participation. We are giving a part of ourselves back to God, supporting the mission of the Church, & caring for those in need.

Pope Benedict once said: "The offertory is not just about bread & wine. It is the place where we offer our whole existence to God, so that it may become united with Christ's offering."

So next time you see the gifts brought forward, don't let your mind wander. Imagine your own life being carried up with that bread & wine. Place yourself spiritually on the altar. And trust that God will take what you offer, bless it, transform it, & give it back to you as the very life of Christ. To be continued...
