UPDATES FROM THE MANAGER

Pool: The pool heater is on, and set at 87°. The shower heater is also hooked up and set at 100°. It seems that there are still people drinking beverages in the pool. Please remember that it is STATE LAW that NO beverages other than "commercially bottled water in plastic containers" is permitted within 4' of the pool or spa.

Storm Repairs: Common Areas: The storm repairs to the Auditorium and Yacht Club are complete! The only item remaining is the fascia on the north side of the Auditorium, but we are hoping that will be done in the next couple weeks.

Your Home: If you haven't addressed the repairs to your own home, please do so! Remember that any exterior work needs to be submitted to the ARC Committee for approval prior to starting (and most work also requires a permit from the City). Compliance notices were sent starting the week of October 27 for any storm damages that haven't been repaired.

<u>Demolitions</u>: The last home was demolished in the park! It's been a long road, but we made it. Thank you for your continued patience while we worked our way through the many schedule changes, etc. After all the storm cleanup and demolitions were finished, the streets were swept clean!

New Committees: Requests for volunteers to serve on the following committees will be sent out when the majority of our residents have returned to the park:

Boat Lift Cover Committee Event Pavilion Committee

Replacement of Maintenance Building(s): The Co-Op Board is considering replacing the maintenance building and shed with one large hurricane-tolerant

building. We are in the process of gathering all of the details, which will be submitted to the Board for review. Once reviewed by the Board, this action will require a positive vote of two-thirds of the Shareholders. Some of the key benefits of this building are:


- Hurricane-Resistant Construction: A secure facility built to withstand major storms.
- Protection of Equipment: In the event of a storm, all maintenance and pool equipment will be stored safely, reducing risk of flooding, weather damage, or vandalism. (Flood insurance only covers equipment stored inside a building.)
- Centralized Storage: Consolidates equipment into one secure location for greater efficiency.
- Operational Hub: Provides a reliable command center for staff during emergencies.
- Enhanced Disaster Recovery: Speeds up recovery in the event of a future disaster. Generators and fuel to run them will be stored onsite.

Exterior Painting: The Co-Op Board approved the painting of the exteriors of the Auditorium and Yacht Club. We worked with the contractor to select more modern, updated colors. This work was completed in mid-November.

<u>Access Control System</u>: The new access control system (fobs) will be installed. All residents will need to obtain new fobs. Please watch your emails for additional details.

Parking Lot Sealing: We are in the process of obtaining quotes to have the Auditorium and Yacht Club parking lots sealed and re-striped.

Zoom Moderators Needed: We are again asking for 3 or 4 share-holders to be on the list of Zoom moderators for the monthly board meetings. The moderator simply watches the chat comments and shares them with the Board during the meeting. If you are interested, please contact the Office.



Blood Donations are Vital



I have been a regular donor at the Tropic Isles Blood Drives for several years. Last season, I had obligations each and every donation day, but this was the year when blood donations became personal. In mid-April of 2025, my husband of 51 years had



major back surgeries to correct a severe scoliosis of his spine. This involved a procedure to insert "spacers" to open up the vertebral spaces that had collapsed over time. The second surgery inserted rods to correct the "bend" of his spine. During this surgery he started to lose blood and, ultimately, required four units of whole blood! Thankfully those donated units of blood helped to resolve a hypotensive crisis. He ended up in ICU for two nights and received another unit of blood before he "graduated" to a step-down-unit to begin to recover. Blood donations are vital. Thanks to blood donations, my husband is now in his 8th month of recovery!

For all of you who I normally join on the Red Bus, I salute you! It may have been your blood that was used! I will be donating at our blood drives again this season in Tropic Isles AND, my husband who always said "Never!" to donating blood, said he will become a donor, too.

"Everyone is a Booster!" The next meeting of the Tropic Isles' Boosters is scheduled for Friday, December 5 at 9:00 AM in the VOLUNTEER Auditorium. We meet the first Friday of

each month in the Auditorium, November-April at 9 AM.

TROPIC ISLES BOOSTERS MEETING - November 7, 2025

Officers Present: Wendy Verstringhe, Linda Doll, Mike Cuff, and Drew Doll. The meeting was called to order by Vice President, Wendy Verstringhe.

Treasurer Report: Mike Cuff reported that the balance after the April meeting was \$14,046.47. The present balance is \$17,380.31. This balance includes a \$2,000.00 donation from Carmen Garcia representing homes she has sold since the last Booster meeting and \$60.00 from Jim and Karen Grant for a driveway sale they recently had. Thank you so much for these generous donations.

Secretary Report: Linda Doll reiterated that the Booster minutes are printed in the Breezes each month. She also reminded those people that are chairmen of an activity (turkey supper, pancake breakfast, soup supper, etc.) that she will need a written report handed in at the meeting.

NEW BUSINESS:

Tropic Isles' Apparel: Jean Volkens turned in a report that she will gather her committee and an inventory will be taken of all remaining Tropic Isles shirts, hats, and visors before any ordering will be done.

Recycling: Bill Pealer reported that the Co-op trailer that they use to redeem cans had 2 flat tires on it and that Drew Doll had them replaced. Drew will be reimbursed by the Co-op. This is not a Booster expense. Jeff and Nancy Cobb redeemed cans in the summer and most recently turned in \$87.00. Bill suggested the committee not scrap any more aluminum because it is heavy and bulky, but will continue to redeem cans. This will be made into a motion and voted on at the December meeting.

Palm Trees: When Don Denby arrives, he will advise us and set up volunteers to do the fertilizing which is usually done in November. At the April meeting, a cap of \$8,000.00 was voted and agreed on to spend for the purchase of new palm trees and the fertilizer.

Storage House: Cheryl Brink spoke about items stored in the Co-opowned storage house. Jeff and Nancy Cobb took care of anything put in there over the summer. There is an inventory of medical equipment (wheelchairs, rollators, walkers, crutches, potty chairs, shower chairs) there. Cheryl is asking for some volunteers to come to the house and do an inventory of what's there. Any excess medical equipment will be donated to the Veterans. Nancy Cobb has accepted some items, posted them, and sold them on Facebook Marketplace for us. If anyone has something special and of "a good value", Nancy can check it out and if acceptable, she will sell it for us.

Health Fair: Cindy Shaw reported that the Dermatology Van that was here last year would like to come back. Could we put together a Health Fair in cooperation with their Van being here? For example, there could be a table set up to do blood pressure checks, a table for other medical information, health insurance information, etc. This will be discussed at the December meeting after the Caring Team has a meeting to discuss it.

Thanksgiving Dinner: Judy Milliken, Chairman of the Thanksgiving Dinner, has had tickets printed. She uses a count of presale tickets sold to estimate how much food and supplies to purchase. Karen Timmerman will be selling tickets. Judy is concerned because some people who had signed up in the past to cook a turkey or help out with food preparation haven't contacted her yet. She was assured that the Thanksgiving Dinner will be held on Thanksgiving Day at 5 PM and open to all residents.







Ember was in his training harness and impressed everyone with his calm demeanor in spite of the large crowd.




Mel and her neighbor, Amy, were the primary raisers of Ember.







Cook's Corner 5-MINUTE APPLE PIE



Ingredients

- 1 apple finely diced, skin on
- ¼ teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1 tablespoon firmly packed brown sugar
- 2 tablespoons water
- 2 teaspoons corn starch or arrowroot flour
- 4 cinnamon graham cracker squares (2 full sheets), crumbled

Instructions

- Place the diced apple in a microwave-safe bowl. Add the cinnamon and brown sugar, stirring until the apple pieces are evenly coated.
- In a small bowl, dissolve the corn starch in water to make a slurry.
 Stir until smooth with no lumps, then pour it into the apple mixture, stirring to combine. This slurry will help thicken the apple mixture.
- Microwave the apple mixture for 1 minute. Carefully remove and stir, then microwave for another minute until thick and gooey.
- Stir in the crumbled graham cracker squares. Divide between 2 small bowls, and if you like, add a dollop of whipped topping and a sprinkle of cinnamon or apple pie spice.

Yield: 2 servings

Cooking for one:

• If you're making this for yourself, stash the leftover half (without the graham cracker) in the fridge, covered. When you're ready to enjoy it, reheat in the microwave until warm, then add the crumbled graham cracker and optional garnishes just before serving.

Safety Tip of the Month ---

Safety-proof your home

- Make sure all hallways, stairs, and paths are well lit and clear of objects such as books or shoes.
- Use rails and banisters when going up and down the stairs. Never place scatter rugs at the bottom or top of stairs.
- Tape all area rugs to the floor so they do not move when you walk on them.

Protect against fire and related dangers

- If there is a fire in your home, don't try to put it out. Leave and call 911. Know at least two ways to get out of your apartment or home.
- When you're cooking, don't wear loose clothes or clothes with long sleeves.
- Replace appliances that have fraying or damaged electrical cords.
- Don't put too many electric cords into one socket or extension cord.
- Install a smoke detector and replace the battery twice a year.
- Never smoke in bed or leave candles burning, even for a short time, in an empty room.
- Make sure heaters are at least 3 feet away from anything that can burn, such as curtains, bedding, or furniture. Turn off space heaters when you leave the room.

Avoid bathroom hazards

- Set the thermostat on the water heater no higher than 120° F to prevent scalding.
- Have grab bars installed in the shower and near the toilet to make getting around easier and safer.
- Put rubber mats in the bathtub to prevent slipping.
- If you are having a hard time getting in and out of your tub, or on and off the toilet, ask your provider to help you get a special tub chair, bench, or raised toilet seat.

- Never try to heat your home with your stove, oven, or grill since these can give off carbon monoxide—a deadly gas that you cannot see or smell.
- Make sure there is a carbon monoxide detector near all bedrooms, and be sure to test and replace the battery two times a year.

Medications

- Keep all medications in their original containers so you don't mix up medicines.
- Ask your pharmacist to put large-print labels on your medications to make them easier to read.
- Take your medications in a well-lit room, so you can see the labels.
- Bring all of your pill bottles with you to your healthcare provider's appointments, so he or she can look at them and make sure you are taking them correctly.

Cleaning products

• Never mix bleach, ammonia, or other cleaning liquids together when you are cleaning. When mixed, cleaning liquids can create deadly gases.

Protect against abuse

- Keep your windows and doors locked at all times.
- Never let a stranger into your home when you are there alone.
- Talk over offers made by telephone salespeople with a friend or family member.
- Do not share your personal information, such as social security number, credit card, bank information, or account passwords, with people you do not know who contact you.
- Always ask for written information about any offers, prizes, or charities and wait to respond until you have reviewed the information thoroughly.
- Do not let yourself be pressured into making purchases, signing contracts, or making donations. It is never rude to wait and discuss the plans with a family member or friend.

Grass Recycling Is Important



We want to take a moment to remind you to practice "grass recycling" when your lawn gets mowed. Grass recycling (or mulching) means leaving clippings on your lawn. This

helps to make sure grass clippings do not blow into bodies of water or onto surfaces such as driveways, sidewalks, or street curbs, where they will eventually end up in the canals during rain events. Nutrients trapped in organic matter, such as grass clippings, leaves, and branches, can be re-released as pollutants when organic debris enters drainage areas, basin canals, and waterways. We all need to do our part to protect our waterways, and making sure to blow your grass clippings back onto your lawn is an important step. Please remind your lawn service to do the same. Thanks!

Kayak Launch Use Reminders




If you are using the Tropic Isles' kayak launch, please make sure to do the following:

Be advised, kayaks may only stay on the racks, if YOU are here in the park. If you are leaving for an extended period of time, please store your kayak in your shed or home where it can be safely secured, especially during hurricane season.





Friendly Reminders

- That we encourage you to follow the "See something, say something, do something" slogan if you see someone not following the rules or trespassing in the park. Take a picture and report it to the Office AND call the Palmetto Police 941-721-2000 Ext. 4.
- If you have corrections or additions to make for the Resident Directory, please complete an Information Form with your information. A copy of the form can be picked up in the Office.
- ARC (Architectural Review Committee) approval is needed for any work that is done on the outside of your home, on your dock, or on your lot. ARC application forms are available in the Office and need to be completed to get placed on the ARC agenda. No work should begin on your project until your final approval letter from the Office is received. An ARC application can be picked up in the Office.
- Make sure the Office has your email address to be included in the important Mail Chimp notices that go out to residents. You can email the Office at info@tropicisles.net to make that request. Mail Chimp requests to make an announcement must be made 48 hours in advance.
- All residents of Tropic Isles Co-op (including private renters) are required to have a **background check** and be approved by the Co-Op. The Board unanimously approved instituting a \$250.00 penalty for any residents/tenants/renters who do not go through the approval process per the Rules and Regulations. The penalty will be posted to the owner's account.
- Remember that NO yard waste (grass clipping, branches, etc.) should end up in the canals or streets. Please notify your lawn care service of this as well.
- That dog owners are EXPECTED to be responsible and pick up after your dog EVERYWHERE and dispose of their waste in the proper container. Dogs must be on a leash throughout the park and in the control of the Resident or an authorized caregiver at all times.



- Smokers, **THERE IS NO SMOKING ON THE POOL DECK**. Use the "Smoking Area" outside of the fence.
- THE POOL IS OPEN 24/7, BUT PLEASE BE CONSIDERATE OF YOUR NEIGHBORS. QUIET HOURS ARE 10 PM TO 8:30 AM.

Architectural Review Committee (ARC) Procedure

ARC approval is needed for **ANY** improvements that happen outside—on your home, dock, or lot. The ARC procedure is as follows:

- 1. ARC application forms are available in the Office and on the website www.tropicisles.net. Fill out an ARC application and submit it to the office. Make sure to include diagrams, drawings, or photos as needed. If possible, please show the neighbor's homes and the distance from each. Include the labels N, S, E, and W directions on your diagrams.
- 2. All applications must be logged in at the Office and assigned a date for review by the ARC Committee or 3-COR.
- 3. The ARC approval process begins with a preliminary review by a 3-person team, referred to as 3-COR. Simple improvements and replacement issues may be approved by this group and not require a review by the full ARC committee.
- 4. The ARC Committee needs a week to review the application and go to the lot before the next meeting date. If there is not enough time to do this, you will have to wait for a future date.
- 5. You will be notified when your request is placed on the agenda for an ARC meeting. 3-COR Meetings are held on the 2nd and 4th Wednesday at 9:30 AM in the Auditorium. ARC Meetings are held on the 1st and 3rd Tuesday at 9:30 AM in the Auditorium and are announced via Mailchimp. You are encouraged to attend the meeting.
- 6. After the meeting, you will be notified, by phone or in writing, as to whether your request is approved or denied.
- 7. If denied, you can appeal the decision to the Board of Directors, if you so choose.
- To obtain a permit from the City, you must first receive the Architectural Review Application <u>approval</u>, signed by the ARC committee and the Manager.
- You must also provide a copy of all required permits to the Office.
- 10. BOTH THE ARC APPLICATION AND THE CITY PERMIT NEED TO BE POSTED ON THE FRONT OF THE HOME BEFORE THE WORK CAN BEGIN.
- 11. NO WORK should begin on your project until your final approval letter from the Office is received. If you fail to get ARC approval for your project before you begin, you may be asked to deconstruct it and/or a fine of \$250 can be imposed. Contact Steve Tourtilotte at 860-682-7656 with any questions you may have.


