Gratitude for Research

Research contributes so much to our lives, often in ways we don't realize we need or are aware of. As people age, keeping one's feet firmly and safely planted on the ground can be a challenge. The consequences of each fall can be catastrophic to one's health.

I heard of an elderly gentleman who was falling repeatedly. It was recommended to his family they keep track of the times he was falling. After a couple of weeks, they had the data collected. Interestingly, their loved one was falling most frequently at 6 a.m. and 3 p.m. Looking back over his life, they remembered that, starting at age 12, those were the times he had gone out to the barn to milk the cows. Those times were still triggering him to get up to move as they were so deeply ingrained in his mind. From that time forward, 95% of his falls were prevented by someone being with him at those hours, thus preventing more falls.
