

The Women of the ELCA

The Women of the ELCA was established 38 years ago, in 1987 with the merger of the American Lutheran Church and Lutheran Church of America. The ELCA is made up of 65 Synods across the United States and the Bahamas. Our synod, the Northwest Synod of Wisconsin (NWSWI) is further divided into seven conferences: Lake Superior, Apple River, Heart of the North, St. Croix Valley, Chippewa Valley, Chequamegon and Dairyland. As Synodical Women's Organization (SWO), we share our geography and conferences with the NWSWI, but we are not the same organization. Your SWO board consists of four officers and a representative from each of the seven conferences. This board normally plans one event each year: a biennial convention and, on the other year, either a Day of Enrichment or Day of Awareness. Our board meets throughout the year, mostly via Zoom, but we are required by our constitution to meet in person at least once per year and this meeting often happens in the fall. Thanks to Zoom, there is not as much traveling required as there used to be.

Each of our seven conferences has its own committee or team that coordinates one or two events each year. You have most likely attended a few or many of these gatherings. It's a great time to get together with old friends and neighbors and to meet new friends, to hear God's Word, learn about something going on near us or perhaps farther away, and to join in fellowship. Right now, several of our conferences are in need of leadership and in need of representation on our Board. If we are to continue to serve our larger church, we need your help. And remember, more than one person can share a position to be co-coordinators or co-representatives! Talk it over with your friends and come up with a plan to serve.

a churchwide level CWO has a webpage womenoftheelca.org where you can obtain information about the resources available. You can sign up to receive

Daily Devotions, Bold Café, and find other resources. Churchwide Women of the ELCA also host a national convention every three years. The next one is scheduled for 2026 to be held in Des Moines, Iowa with the theme "I am Worthy." The 2026 Triennial convention itself will be held on Zoom, while the Gathering that follows the convention will be held in Des Moines. Some information can be found in this Northwester and more information will be forthcoming in future newsletters.

Help us to move into the future and to contact those women who may not be involved in the church right now. Help us to show them what is available. Maybe all it will take is to ask them. It could be that asking could help our church families to grow, we just need to ask Jesus to help us share the stories, the Gospel, and his love, to let them know that all are loved and valuable.

2026 TRIENNIAL GATHERING THEME

In 2017, Leymah Gbowee, Nobel Peace Prize recipient, challenged gathering participants to reclaim space and place for women and girls. Finding our voice and using it gives way to the light we possess. The world has worn women thin by defining for us who we are, what we can do and be. We use these two words to introduce ourselves and establish our identity in the public square. "I am" is how disciples proclaim their identity, intent, and actions.

I AM WORTHY continues our journey with Jesus through the lingering effects of the brokenness this **community of women created in the image of God— called to discipleship** and the world have endured.

Acknowledging what we have been through is the beginning of healing. These words are both an affirmation for the community of women as disciples. This proclamation reminds us of God's promise to always be with us, and God is always with us, through devastation and division that will surely be present. God is a gifted power in claiming who we are and whose we are.

I AM WORTHY is the very basis of our spiritual nature. Repeating "**I AM WORTHY**" can reprogram our subconscious mind by reminding us of who God is and the Holy Spirit's continual work at challenging negative daily chatter. The practice of this self-affirmation creates pathways for the opportunity to repair and bring healing to us, the church, society, and the world.

The ancient Japanese art of kintsugi embraces brokenness and restoring what is broken as gift— the opportunity to repair. The art of kintsugi uses gold to repair broken pottery. Using gold, the very best to beautify and strengthen redeeming the pot to better than it was. This symbolism of healing and resilience is exactly what Christ did for us on the cross.

When we say, "I AM WORTHY," we align ourselves with God's promises. And there is power in our resolve—




