


Luther puts into words the very purpose statement that we read at our meetings.

- WE are the way God's love flows into the world and through community.
- Our stations and offices, locations, and responsibilities help us see who our neighbors are and what they need.
- The primary way we are involved in ministry is through our specific roles and the actual place we find ourselves.
- The way we love our neighbor is through ordinary moments and activities of our life.
- In most cases, our callings are imposed on us by our life situation - not by what we chase after or what professional decisions we make.

 The starting point for ministry is not the church. It is the place we find ourselves every day.

One of the churches that I visited is Cross Lutheran Church in Roberts. This incredible group of women is hosting our Morning of Renewal in April. Save the date: Saturday, April 18, 2026. Posters coming soon.

#### Let's Learn Spanish!

A small group of people from the Synod spent two days in November learning speak Spanish. to Instructor Lidixe Montoya began teaching how to pronounce vowels. What's cool about Spanish is, unlike English, each vowel only has one Once vowels were sound. mastered, the lessons moved to consonants, which are complex. For example, the letter J is pronounced like H, the letter H is silent, etc. Students practiced their skills by reading poetry and short stories.

Trinity Lutheran in Eau Claire hosted the class, and around midday, the group went to La Luna Market y Restaurant on London Upon arrival, the group Road. moved to the restaurant in the back of the building. The assignment for the class was to order from the menu using newly learned Spanish skills. The waiter was very gracious provided much needed and with assistance the menu. Everyone was able to order something they like and fully enjoyed a wonderful meal. lunch, the group returned to the church for further lesson.

Three people from the local Spanish-speaking community joined the class on the second day. They were partnered with class members and assigned to shop for recipe supplies on another trip to La Luna Market. Returning to the church, everyone worked together in the kitchen to follow the recipes to make several items for lunch including tortillas, guacamole, and Horchata. The lunch was delicious!

For the final lesson, class members were assigned parts of the liturgy to read in Spanish during the Misa de Adviento (Advent Mass) at Immanuel Lutheran Church on December 6.

# 2026 TRIENNIAL GATHERING THEME

In 2017, Leymah Gbowee, Nobel Peace Prize recipient, challenged gathering participants to reclaim space and place for women and girls. Finding our voice and using it gives way to the light we possess. The world has worn women thin by defining for us who we are, what we can do and be. We use these two words to introduce ourselves and establish our identity in the public square. "I am" is how disciples proclaim their identity, intent, and actions.

**I AM WORTHY** continues our journey with Jesus through the lingering effects of the brokenness this **community of women created in the image of God— called to discipleship** and the world have endured.

Acknowledging what we have been through is the beginning of healing. These words are both an affirmation for the community of women as disciples. This proclamation reminds us of God's promise to always be with us, and God is always with us, through devastation and division that will surely be present. God is a gifted power in claiming who we are and whose we are.

**I AM WORTHY** is the very basis of our spiritual nature. Repeating "**I AM WORTHY**" can reprogram our subconscious mind by reminding us of who God is and the Holy Spirit's continual work at challenging negative daily chatter. The practice of this self-affirmation creates pathways for the opportunity to repair and bring healing to us, the church, society, and the world.

The ancient Japanese art of kintsugi embraces brokenness and restoring what is broken as gift— the opportunity to repair. The art of kintsugi uses gold to repair broken pottery. Using gold, the very best to beautify and strengthen redeeming the pot to better than it was. This symbolism of healing and resilience is exactly what Christ did for us on the cross.

When we say, "**I AM WORTHY**," we align ourselves with God's promises. And there is power in our resolve—

"In him was life, and that life was the light of all humankind. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." **John 1:4-5**.

"I am fearfully and wonderfully made" Psalm 139:14.
