



SCHOOL RULES & REGULATIONS

- Three (3) categories of offences
- Difference: nature of consequence applied for each

CATEGORY A:

BEHAVIOUR

1. Intentional absence- lessons, assembly and roll call, clubs, activities, etc
2. Homework incomplete or not done
3. Lateness-school, lessons, activities, etc.
4. Littering, careless dumping of litter, failure to observe cleanliness, tidiness, hygiene, etc.
5. Loud disruption e.g. by shouting, yelling, etc.
6. Improper school uniform
7. Graffiti, vandalism - walls, boards or furniture, lockers, etc.
8. Use of foul language
9. Eating and drinking in classrooms (except water).
10. Chewing gum in school
11. Loitering along the corridors, washrooms and around the lockers during lesson time.

CONSEQUENCES

Breach of common sense is breach of law

- The student must write a reflective statement detailing their behaviour and outlining steps they will take to prevent a recurrence.
- Recording of behaviour in a behaviour book.
- Maximum of two (2) verbal warnings.
- After-school detention.
- Immediate payment is required for damages resulting from graffiti and vandalism.

All offences in category A will be recorded in a behaviour book. Three entries in the behaviour book will escalate the case to the next level. Repeated occurrences of the behaviour(s) will be considered disobedience, which is a more serious offence.

CATEGORY B

BEHAVIOUR

1. Disobedience or insolence.
2. Improper conduct during prep.
3. Not adhering to the lights-out policy in the boarding houses.
4. Failure to follow food or cafeteria rules
5. Stylish hairstyles, haircuts, hair accessories; disallowed grooming practices, such as beads, perms, nail polish, and earrings. A pair of small

earrings is permitted. For girls, only black or coffee brown braided hair, shoulder length, and tied back in a puff is allowed. For boys, well-combed, neat haircut is acceptable.

6. Fighting
7. Religious extremism
8. Misconduct on school transport and during outings.
9. Possession, use, or trading of obscene and/or pornographic materials.
10. Malicious damage of school property
11. Possession and use of prohibited electronic devices in learning areas without permission.

CONSEQUENCES

- 1st offence – temporary exclusion for two (2) weeks.
- 2nd offence – permanent exclusion pending a decision by the Board of Governors.
- Other potential consequences as determined by the authority figure.
- In the event of malicious damage of school property, the payment will be made immediately.

CATEGORY C:

BEHAVIOUR

1. Bullying and constant teasing
2. Cheating, plagiarism, forgery or altering records.
3. Engaging in violent behaviour
4. Intimacy of any sexual nature.
5. Possession, use of and trading in intoxicants
6. Theft
7. Leaving the school campus or boarding house at any time, without permission.
8. Gambling
9. Any form of discrimination (e.g. religion, race, colour, tribe, etc.).
10. Tampering with installations
11. Visiting boarding houses of the opposite sex or staff residences.
12. Failing to report serious breaches of the code of conduct.

CONSEQUENCES

- Capital offences are considered entirely unacceptable. Students involved may face indefinite suspension while awaiting a decision from the Board of Governors.
