As you are aware, we restructured our system at the beginning of this academic year to enhance service delivery and improve our staff performance. The academic year has gone through a number of achievements save for a few; Accreditation of IB Programms (PYP and MYP), Diploma in IB candidacy approval, ready to go through the rigorous approval process again to enroll students in September 2026, a wonderful awards

Our pastoral team has improved greatly in safeguarding methods and improved students' leadership and involvement. Our sports department has tremendously improved at both Junior and Senior levels. We will continue supporting them as our basketball arena and multipurpose sports complex is set to open to the public this September 2025.

Our curriculum office has intensified its monitoring of academics seriously by introducing manage Bac platform in IB and Senatical software in Cambridge curriculum to improve our culture of feedback in the ecosystem.

Our spiritual growth in all spheres of our religious affiliations has been emphasized, facilitated and enhanced to cultivate the values of belief and honesty.



Because of this growth and your partnership, we are embarking on expanding our instruction and resource rooms as well as improving the quality of our staff; meals and accommodation. Very soon our IB block for MYP and DP classes

will commence. We will also begin our early Years classes in IB in Sept 2025. We have also planned to have 15 places for a day care effective Sept 2025. Look for the information about these additions from our communications office.

We understand the financial challenges we are all going through as the world economies stumble, we will therefore **NOT** increase school fees. However, for High school Cambridge, we would love each learner to have a set of all textbooks in his class to improve our reading and comprehension cultures. This will be alongside the soft copies. We have therefore reflected this in our resource by expanding it by USD 100 (one hundred US dollars).

Our department of learners with learning barriers remains a priority as we improve its technical staff and equipment alongside other learners' support facilities, effective Sept 2025, we will have dedicated staff for ESL (English as a second language), this will help our communities from Francophone countries or non-English speaking countries that have always struggled to stabilize in the system.

Our candidate learners have completed their International Examination, please note the dates when results will be released and make sure the school funds are cleared to zero balance to avoid inconveniences.

As the academic year draws to a close, we find ourselves reflecting on a season filled with transformation, progress, resilience, and renewed purpose. Though our journey is still unfolding, we are proud of the strides we've taken together.

A JOYFUL START, A SHARED PURPOSE

Since joining the Kabojja family, I have been welcomed into a vibrant community that truly values learning, compassion, and excellence. It has been an honour to serve alongside educators, students, and families who are committed to shaping futures. Ours is a school that understands that success is not built by individuals alone but through meaningful partnerships—and we are steadfast in creating a nurturing, inclusive, and responsive

environment for all.

Central to our growth has been our ongoing effort to strengthen the link between home and school. Through new systems and open dialogue, we are making parents integral partners in the learning journey. We believe that when educators and families work in harmony, every child benefits.

INVESTING IN TEACHERS: LIFELONG LEARNERS

One of the most encouraging trends this year has been the number of teachers embracing professional development. In collaboration with our partners in the United Kingdom and Cambridge University Press and Assessment, we have seen remarkable participation in training focused on inclusive education, syllabus implementation, and modern teaching strategies. LOOKING AFTER RESOURCES: A NEW CHAPTER IN INDEPENDENCE

We are excited to announce a major investment in learning resources for the next academic year. As part of our commitment to improving access to knowledge, the school will be providing textbooks to students across various subjects. This initiative is intended to foster greater academic independence, resourcefulness, and responsibility among learners.

However, with this privilege comes responsibility. These books are school property, and students are expected to take good care of them throughout the year. If a textbook is lost or damaged, the school library will invoice parents for its replacement. We ask you to support us by reinforcing with your children the importance of safeguarding these valuable resources.

This investment reflects our belief that equipping students with the right tools enables them to take ownership of their learning and become self-reliant thinkers—an essential part of the Kabojja learner profile.

CELEBRATING LEARNER PROGRESS

One of the proudest highlights of the year was our Awards Day, where we celebrated academic excellence and recognized achievement through a more structured and transparent system. This initiative has helped set clear standards and inspired our learners to aim higher.

Our Cambridge examination classes, having undertaken mock exams and extensive preparation, began their final exams in mid-April. We are proud of their resilience and optimism and look forward to the results with confidence.

We also send our warmest congratulations to the Year 13 class as they step out into the world. These learners carry with them the values, skills, and spirit of Kabojja, and we are proud to call them our ambassadors. Similarly, our Year 11 students have demonstrated commitment and growth. Many are now preparing to transition into Sixth Form, guided by clear academic entry requirements, including five IGCSE passes, with a C grade or higher in their chosen A-Level subjects.

ACADEMIC STRUCTURE AND LEADERSHIP SUPPORT

We continue to work closely with the careers department to ensure that subject choices in Sixth Form align with learner strengths and future aspirations. We discourage learners from taking on four A-Level subjects unless they have a proven track record of academic excellence. The goal is not quantity, but quality and balance.

Our Key Stage Coordinators have played an integral role in our learners' development:

Mr. Derrick Ssenyonga has engaged tirelessly with both students and

parents to provide guidance and support.

Mr. Stanley Kalyango has served as a dependable and compassionate mentor to our Key Stage 3 learners.

Mr. Kabanda has brought calm and consistency to our Sixth Form students, guiding them with grace through their final school years.

We also extend our sincere appreciation to Mr. Kirya, our Examinations Officer, whose behind-the-scenes efforts have ensured order, accuracy, and integrity in all our assessments.

To all our teachers—your dedication, energy, and unwavering professionalism have made a tremendous difference. We thank you.

ENHANCING SYSTEMS: TECHNOLOGY AND REPORTING

To strengthen communication, we've launched Senatical, a new Learning Management System (LMS) designed to streamline academic processes. Teachers will now be able to record assessment data and monitor student progress more effectively. Beginning next academic year, school reports will be emailed to parents. Please make sure your contact information is current to avoid missing this communication.

In 2026, Senatical will be opened to parents for real-time access to grades, attendance, and academic updates—a major step toward transparency and accountability.

We are also pleased to introduce the Cambridge Lower Secondary Checkpoint assessment for Year 9 learners, beginning in March 2026. This diagnostic tool is designed to help us identify learning gaps and realign instruction for better outcomes. Our academic teams are already working diligently to align their content with Cambridge's curriculum frameworks.

STRENGTHENING DISCIPLINE AND CHARACTER

Our commitment to academic excellence is matched by our focus on discipline and personal development. In collaboration with the Pastoral Department, we are introducing academic detentions and suspensions for serious academic misconduct such as skipping classes and failing to submit assignments. These updates will be communicated to students and signed at the start of the academic year.

We aim to cultivate not only bright minds but also responsible, disciplined, and ethical individuals. Character development is essential to our vision.

UPDATED REPORTING SYSTEM

To improve assessment clarity and reduce administrative workload, we have introduced a three-tier reporting structure:

Summary Reports: Based on continuous assessments, with effort grades.

Term Reports: Based on formal exams, including written comments.

Mock Reports: For examination classes, reflecting final exam readiness.

Each learner will receive two Term Reports per year, complemented by Summary Reports that provide quick snapshots of progress. This allows teachers to focus more on meaningful instruction while still offering comprehensive feedback.

WORKING TOGETHER FOR OUR LEARNERS

We recognize that some families may seek external tutoring. While we do not discourage this, we urge you to first consult the school. Often, the support students need is already available to them within our academic and pastoral systems—free of charge. Let's work collaboratively to ensure learners are not overwhelmed and that school-based interventions are fully utilized.

LOOKING AHEAD WITH HOPE AND DETERMINATION

As we prepare for a new academic year, we are filled with optimism. The future of Kabojja International School is bright—our learners are maturing, our systems are evolving, and our community is growing stronger every day. We will continue to hold ourselves accountable, to innovate boldly, and to work closely with you—our parents and guardians—towards the common goal of nurturing a generation that is reflective, confident, capable, and grounded in the values of Ubuntu.

The pastoral office is pleased to report our learners' significant progress in intentionally improving their behaviour in alignment with their commitment to their academic purpose.

We thank you for listening with understanding, making time to come in when called upon, and working together with us this academic year. It is this partnership that has enabled us to foster a more supportive and disciplined environment, reinforce shared values, and guide your children toward becoming more responsible, respectful, and focused individuals. As such, to honour and sustain these positive gains, our message at this time of the year, primarily serves as a reminder of these key areas where you contributed to their success and where our partnership will remain essential.

Return dates and times are always communicated by the school well in advance. All returning students must be cleared by the finance office first before being allowed to resume school life. We kindly ask that you adhere strictly to the specified timings. Learners will not be received after the stated hours, as designated staff duty will no longer be available past that time. Please also note that boarding parents are not permitted to release or receive students outside the stated times. The pastoral office does not also accept pickup requests sent via email from

siblings or other relatives other than parents and registered guardians. As always, we are happy to support you, should you alert us in time about any challenge that might delay your child's timely arrival back to school.

Over time, we noted that one of the reasons for lack of lesson preparedness includes student's lack of personal stationery. As of next term, we will require your child to come with a mathematical set plus pencils and pens for daily use. We are in the process of replacing ballpoint pens with gel pens, so please take this into consideration as you make the term's stationery purchases. All learners have access to a personal locker within the academic block designed to be used for school-related supplies only. Any damages or losses made in relation to the locker is chargeable immediately.

In addition to the mentions by the head of curriculum, students who do not observe punctuality will serve detention on Saturdays. Take note that any child who has served 3 detentions will be temporarily excluded from school. Lessons begin at 8:00am and end by 3:20 pm. Please ensure that you plan accordingly so that your child arrives in time for roll call which takes place at 7:45am. Day students are not permitted to attend night prep. However, they may use the library until no later than 6:00 p.m. It is important that you keep track of your child's after school movement and requests to stay on longer particularly if they do not have an after-school activity. Your support of our safeguarding efforts by ensuring that your child is picked up on time is appreciated.

Your efforts in ensuring that your child has proper school uniform is commendable. We encourage you to conduct regular checks on the condition and fit of your child's school uniform pieces. Students now have full clarity on our grooming expectations e.g. type and size of earrings, the colour and length of braids plus allowable haircuts amongst boys (pegged at 2 guard). Wearing make-up is

prohibited in school. As you make uniform purchases, please note that:

- All uniforms should be properly labelled with your child's names. The uniform office offers this service at your request.
- Skirt lengths should be appropriately modest, ensuring your daughter can bend, walk, and sit comfortably and gracefully and worn with body stockings that are in wearable condition.
- Boys should not replace inner vests with T-shirts as undergarments and must wear a belt as part of their uniform.
- Trousers should be of an appropriate length, ensuring the socks remain covered when standing or walking with a fit that enables them to sit and move with ease.
- Crocs are not to be used for PE and games; learners need to wear sports shoes.

The uniform office is open daily from Monday to Friday, with adjusted hours on reopening day after official school breaks. Beginning next academic year, should your child continuously violate uniform expectations linked to this, we will contact you for approval to issue a replacement and for billing purposes. The school reserves the right to handle behaviour that goes against our uniform and grooming guidance without prior notice to parents, including immediate correction and/or permanent confiscation of any (additional) adornments that do not follow this policy.

Students are not permitted to use phones during the school day. Day scholars must register and surrender their phones at the gate each morning and collect them at 3:30 p.m. To promote healthy rest and academic focus, boarding students, except for Years 11–13, must hand in their phones by 10:00 p.m. from Sunday to Thursday and receive them back at 3:30 p.m. the next day. They may keep their phones all day on Saturdays and Sundays. Kindly bear this in mind when contacting your child,

especially across time zones. For urgent matters during the day, calls can be made through the front desk. We encourage you to consider having your child leave their phone at home, as it is not needed at all during school hours. Should your child need to bring their phone to school, you will be notified officially by their teacher.

In our determination to ensure that you get your child enrolled in co-curricular activities (a.k.a. clubs) and to maximise on time, we aim at getting these started by the second week of each term. To this end, we request your assistance in signing the clubs consent forms and sending them our way on time. Scanned, emailed copies are also acceptable. Unless otherwise stated in the clubs' consent forms, the termly fee per club is USD 65, payable via the school's bank accounts. As you do so, please share the proof of payment with the finance office, which will assist them in identifying what the payment is

As part of nurturing our learners' spiritual growth and well-being, we kindly seek your support in encouraging your child(ren) to

attend prayer sessions on either Friday or Sunday. In the coming term, we will be enrolling Catholic students for catechism lessons conducted by a priest. Should you wish to register your child(ren), kindly notify the pastoral office with their name and class.

To support security and oversight, only transparent or translucent water bottles are allowed on campus. Please avoid purchasing fizzy drinks, chewing gum and cooked food items as part of snacks for your child. Please be advised that birthday cakes from outside are not permitted either. If confiscated, any prohibited food items brought to school will be discarded. At the core, always check what your child has packed.

A significant number of learners have reported nutritional health conditions that were not disclosed on their admission forms. Please be advised that we can only adequately and safely support your child's dietary needs if we receive clear guidance through a dietician's note. Additionally, and for safety of our learners, apart from those your child might need in emergency situations (like

inhalers), all medication your child needs to take while at school must be handed over to the school doctor or nurse, along with a written prescription from a certified medical practitioner. Please keep us informed of any changes in your child's health status, as this is vital to enabling us to provide the most comprehensive and appropriate care possible noting that only information provided by a qualified medical practitioner will be considered. Prior to picking your child when they report being unwell, always encourage them to visit the school nurse first, so that action can be taken quickly for proper care and attention.

Thank you for engaging with us via pastoral@kabojjainternational.com as regards picking your child for essential appointments, weekend or school breaks, and any well-being concerns you wished for us to address. As a reminder, should you be sending someone different to pick your child, please include their details alongside your child's name and class in the email. We laud you for this collaboration which has enabled us to process your requests in time.

working with Year One teachers to support new students who were not able to accomplish the set bench marks so as to ensure a smooth transition into primary school.


EYFS ORIENTATION -12TH JUNE 2025
