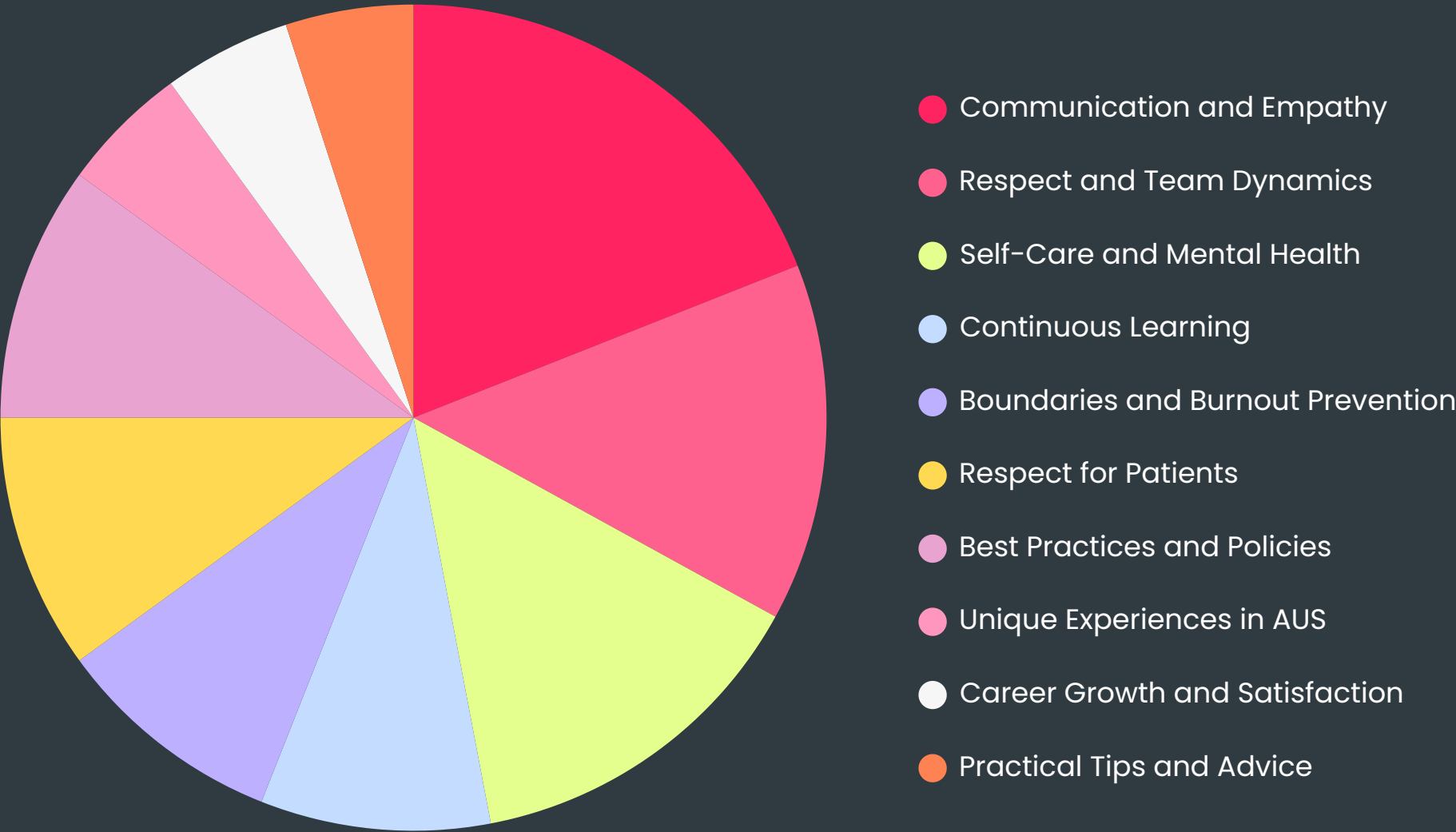

1. Communication and Empathy

KEY INSIGHTS:
