Border Rivers Christian College is an Independant Prep - Year 12 Co-educational College.

Student Numbers

The 2022 school year began with 114 students enrolled in the school. At the completion of the 2022 school year, we had 126 students enrolled.

Distinctive Curriculum Offerings / Extra Curricular

Students at Border Rivers Christian College engage in a strong grounding of curriculum offerings, providing pathways to further education and training. As a Christian School, we offer Christian Living as a subject from Prep to Year 10, focusing on biblical truth and application. Students engaged in service-based activities such as Meals on Wheels, and they conduct regular Chapel / Assembly, leading the service, singing, and introducing guest speakers. Students from 7-9 engage in a wide range of elective programs which allow them to explore their individual interests. Students are encouraged to also pursue musical and sporting endeavours and the Arts. Students are supported to participate in the Goondiwindi Eisteddfod in a range of areas.

Social Climate

Border Rivers Christian College fosters a caring environment informed by a Biblical world view. Child protection, behaviour management and anti-bullying policies and programs are in place with an emphasis on prevention.

Staff structures support student pastoral care through Home Room Teachers, the College Chaplain and the College on-site counsellor.

A weekly Chapel Service is part of the school program and regular school sporting competitions are held to encourage a whole school social atmosphere.

We have a number of volunteers who regularly help at the College and support the learning of students.

LETTER & UPDATE FROM PRINCIPAL.

2022 was a challenging year with a "new normal" established but restrictions in place that limited true engagement from the community. Despite this, student results continued to be pleasing with strong results achieved in NAPLAN and QCE alike.

Students engaged in numerous activities such as Bike Week, Swimming carnival, etc that had not been possible the previous years. Due to economic issues a decrease in enrolments occurred as families moved from the area.

Our offerings and pathways continued to develop to ensure that each student was able to achieve their desired outcome. Working closely with a number of local businesses students achieved school-based apprenticeships (SBAs) these then translated into apprenticeships at the end of their year 12. Subsequently, we had students also access their first university preference and go on to further study in the tertiary sector.

Students participated in a number of different academic competitions, from ICAS to the Junior Science Olympiad. Students are encouraged to try different experiences and stretch their learning.

For another year Lilly's Dance Academy has operated from BRCC. It, is fantastic to see members of the community accessing the college.

We look forward to reconnecting with our community and continuing to be Goondiwindi's school of choice.


