## NEW YORK STATE: HOW DOES LEGISLATION WORK?

### **A Bill Gets Proposed**

State Bills are proposed by one or more Assembly sponsors and one or more State Senate sponsors who are joined by cosponsors. The Bill is then reviewed by committees before being passed to their full House for a vote.



## Voting

In most cases involving State legislation, a bill needs at least half the members of both the Senate and the Assembly to vote "yes" for it to pass. There are times, however, when a bill needs more than half the members to vote "yes" for it to pass. The bill must pass both the Assembly and the Senate before the Governor can consider it.

### **A Bill Gets Proposed**

In New York City, bills are proposed and a public hearing is held on the proposed legislation.

After committee debate and public testimony, the bill may be amended.

The committee meets to vote on the final version of the bill. If passed in committee, the bill is sent to the full Council for more debate and a final vote.
