

TECH MISCELLANEOUS

Music for a 6-Volt Car

I was able to add music to my 1954 Commander for under \$100, not counting the speakers.

Let me start out saying that I tend to do some things the hard way. If I was smarter, I would have just bought a rechargeable Bluetooth speaker and just laid it in the back seat. However, I wanted a system integrated with the car in such a way that it would be hidden, and could be removed in the future without leaving a trace.

Challenge: Create an inexpensive way to play music from my phone that was compatible with the Commander's 6-volt positive ground. Also, it was desirable to have a system that was fairly low in current so as not to have an excess drain on the generator. Most modern amplifiers designed for cars require 12 volts, therefore I needed a step-up voltage regulator. I also wanted a way to charge my phone (5 volts), so I needed a step-down regulator. And with a positive ground system, I needed a way to isolate the entire system from ground. Sounds expensive, but here is the cost of the components:

Key Components and cost:

\$34.00 BOSS Audio Systems CE102 2 Channel 100 Watt Car Amplifier

\$14.00 DC-DC 6-30V to 5V 9V Voltage Step Down Regulator with USB Charging Module

\$30.00 DIGITEN DC 6V 5-11V to 12V 10A Step up Converter Regulator

\$10.00 Flush Mount Cable Kit with 3.5mm Female AUX and USB

\$10.00 Charging Audio Cable

Some components that I already had: Plexiglass (Lexan), speakers, and screws to mount the system. Also not shown / discussed is a method to hold the phone while driving.



One dilemma I had was whether to connect the phone with a wire, or wirelessly. With a wired system, I can play music, use the navigator, and charge the phone at the same time. With a wireless system using Bluetooth, you don't have an unsightly cord, but the phone battery can run down fairly quickly, so a charging cable is nice to have anyway. Also, a wired system is cheaper. Yes, I went cheaper, er, ah, wired.

Speaker considerations: Where to place the speaker/s, and size are the greatest consideration. Many people put a single speaker under the dash where the original speaker was. The amplifier I chose has two outputs, which cannot be connected together. If a single speaker is used, it must be a dual voice coil speaker with left and right inputs. Some amplifiers have a crossover output, which combines the left and right speaker outputs so that a single speaker can be used, however most of these units intend the crossover output to be connected to a subwoofer, and therefore limit the output to low frequency. My car already had aftermarket speakers in the doors, so initially I used them. Since then, I switched to a dual voice coil speaker from Retro Sound. Another consideration is that most aftermarket speakers are designed for lots of power. A 500 watt system would sound great, however my goal was to have a lower current draw. Therefore, I used a 100 watt power amplifier. The challenge is to find good sounding speakers designed for lower power. Powering speakers designed for 500 watts with a system that outputs much less power just sounds dull. Just match the power ratings as best as possible.

Success: A decent sounding system on the cheap, hidden, and can be removed easily in the future. Worth it: Absolutely not. If anyone wants to do something similar, I can provide more information, but my advice is to just buy a Bluetooth speaker.




