

HISTORIC AND TECH

Tommy and Peggy

Electric vehicles over a century ago? YES. It looks like the capital not only uses code names for the president and those close to them, but also their cars. Let me introduce you to Tommy and Peggy.

In 1908 Congressmen of the U.S. Capital was concerned about getting from the Cannon House Building and to the Russell Senate Building without the hot and cold weather affecting them. The superintendent Elliot Woods commissioned a tunnel system to build the Russell Tunnel. This brought into play Tommy and Peggy, two electric Studebakers to run in the Russell underground tunnel delivering its occupants from House to Senate.

Tommy and Peggy were not your run of the mill vehicles. They consisted of two driver seats, so that they could move backwards and forward because the tunnel at the time was narrow and didn't allow for turning around. Tommy and Peggy would go the 1/5-mile-long length at an amazing speed of 12 to 15 MPH and then switch driving positions for the return. They made the trip 225 times per day carrying no more than 12 passengers at a time. The bonus-emissions free.

Peggy and Tommy came into service with their code names when the tunnel opened on March 7, 1909. Their cost was approximately twice the cost of public electric vehicles, \$2,944.00 each.

Tommy and Peggy serviced their country for almost a decade and then was replaced in 1916 by a monorail. Tommy and Peggy went into storage, auctioned as government surplus for \$35.00, restored, and shown at the New York's World Fair. Peggy has made a home at the Studebaker Museum. Tommy was purchased by William Swigart and has been restored by his widow which resulted in Tommy winning the National Automotive Heritage Award at the Elegance at Hersey in Pennsylvania.

Caterpillar Car Show & Servicing The 1937

Nora & I were invited by Charina (sister) & Kevin to the Caterpillar Car Show in Sahuarita. This show has been around several years & never disappoints. The drive to the Caterpillar Testing Grounds is thru some beautiful country. The Cat display (1930's to present) is fantastic & includes some of the largest Cats I have ever seen.

The car show has many Southern Az cars that do not usually show up for Tucson shows, so that is neat. All cars are under cover plus there are FOOD trucks & other vendors. There are several old cars in our neighborhood of which we only get glimpses of. They showed up so we got to meet our neighbors & look the cars over. All proceeds of the entry fee (\$25) go to local charities, so that is neato!

I have been working on the '37 coupe lately getting it ready for Drive Your Studebaker Day. Cooling system was first. Did a short run down I-19 to get it warmed up with the heater on. Back home & parked next to Monsoon ditch. It is very considerate of Pima Co to provide me with a place to drain my anti-freeze! I have been told for years NOT to use cooling system cleaners as they are VERY CORROSIVE! So flush with clean water till water coming out bottom of radiator is clear. After it drains for a while I close the drain plug on the radiator & refill w/ 2&1/2 gallons of pre mixed anti-freeze. Test drive with heater on-check for leaks (none), so on to next job.

The '37 is my FAVORITE Stude we have owned out of 46 cars & trucks BUT it is the heaviest-lowest to ground & hardest to work on! As my mom said "SO GOES LIFE". I was dismayed at how much I have forgotten but fortunately I made notes for each car & saved the notes! A normal size floor jack will not fit under the car & have room for the handle to operate so I have learned to use a small floor jack-install jack stands-switch jacks raise car all the way up & put spacers under jack stands. Drained the warm oil & replaced oil pan plug. Now I am too tired to do any more work. Oh well tomorrow is always a better day! Next day I filled crankcase with 6 Qts 30W non detergent & changed oil filter. Speaking of oil filters-when we bought '37 in 1995 it had no oil filter, so I did some research. Found out that the factory oil filter was almost impossible to find-possibly very expensive & maybe not as good (?) as a modern filter. In our stock of spare parts were several remote bypass oil filters for mid 1962 & earlier V8's. So, I was able to install the oil filter & had 10 Fram PB50 filters in stock so I'm good for a few more years. Also, I added ZDDP.

Because we only drove old cars I am a big fan of electric fuel pumps & had installed a 6V pump on '37. I put a fuel filter between the fuel tank & pump plus another fuel filter at the carb. Fortunately, I had these filters in stock so changed both.

Chassis lube jobs are a lot of work. We used to drive 35,000 miles a year, so me and our son (probably son) did 17 oil changes a year. I think most of our Studes had 12-15 grease zerks - '37 has 25 which includes one on the water pump. I pump grease in all the zerks until the new grease comes out somewhere EXCEPT only 1 pump of grease in water pump & rear wheel bearings. I remember helping someone whose rear brakes had failed-he kept pumping grease into the zerks on the rear axle & eventually the excess grease made it's way to the brake linings. Those brake linings were very shiny!

Years ago, I decided it was too hard to remove the front carpet to check the master cylinder so I installed a remote brake fluid reservoir. That has really worked out good for me. Next things to check were the overdrive trans & the rear differential. Rear end was good but trans was low. I used to have a 5 gal can of 85W90 gear oil with a metal hand pump that I put on casters. Man that was nice but it is long gone. Parts stores have a plastic pump that fits on 1 gal plastic oil jugs but with only 1 car to service I decided to go another way. I ordered a quart of gear oil-mixed it with Redline oil put a 12" piece of tubing on the container nipple and squeezed away! It actually worked. Here is my story on Redline. GI's who served in WW2 fell in love with British sports cars & brought them home. Mommy may I keep this car that followed me home? Americans have never really mastered the art of shifting British gear boxes. Enter Redline oil. This stuff is fabulous! We have been using it in our Morris Minors since 1968 & we drove them over 250,000 miles including a trip to Denver. In 1979 we bought a 1963 Transtar 1 ton which had a 5-speed overdrive New Process trans. It was difficult to shift so added Redline to gearbox & it was smooth as silk. The '37 shifted fairly smooth when we got it in 1995 but the addition of Redline made it better.

I double checked all my work under the car-took it off jackstands-rechecked oil-antifreeze-brake fluid, checked air pressure in tires & off for a test drive. Imagine my surprise when it started — sometimes stuff I work on does Not start when I get done.
