#### In Memory: Bruce Eneboe 1955 - 2023



### Vega Steering Box in a C Cab Pickup

Our SAC SDC member Lou Fencl remarked that he installed a Chevrolet Vega steering gear box in his C-Cab truck approximately 30 years ago. His Studebaker became more pleasurable to steer. After injuring my right shoulder, I decided it was time to take Lou's suggestions and bite the bullet.

From Amazon, I purchased a new Vega steering gear box in a kit that contained the gear box, the pitman arm, two steering U-joints, mounting bracket, and the steering shaft. Getting rid of the old steering gear box required removing the original steering wheel and the four bolts from the box. It's handy to have the vehicle front end raised to accommodate the removal of the 3' long steering shaft.

I used the front lower bolt hole from the original steering box and temporarily bolted the Vega steering box to the new mounting bracket. Then I adjusted the angle of the steering box to pivot it to the angle that I wanted which held it in that position to drill the other holes for the bracket that mounted the new steering box. To make sure that the pitman arm was able to move freely without any interference from hitting the bottom of the engine or the leaf springs. The pitman arm now faces the front of the vehicle instead of the rear of the vehicle. I welded the top hole of the bracket to the top of the truck's frame. It was to my advantage to use my original steering shaft which I shortened 2" and welded a piece of new "double D" steering shaft to the

end of my original steering shaft. The "double D" end needs to fit into the universal joint which is connected to the Vega steering box. The column needs to be shortened to match the new steering shaft. At the end of the project, my steering wheel is currently angled upwards and is 2" closer to the dashboard which eliminates the steering wheel from rubbing my belly.

The truck steers more pleasurably with the new Vega steering box and I wished that I had replaced the steering gear box years ago.

#### **WIG WAG**

One of the many items Woody Allen gave us was a manual for the use of Studebaker Salesmen titled "The Inside Story Of The 1937 Studebakers". These dealership showroom manuals are a wealth of information and have incredible color pictures of all the different models including beautiful interiors designed by Helen Dryden. After reading this book from cover to cover I learned that the correct name for our car was Dictator Custom Coupe. Not only does the manual include ALL specifications but shows a picture of the Wig Wag Signal Light sold by Wig Wag Corporation of New York. I'm not sure when I became interested in Wig Wag brake lights but quickly realized that I could NOT afford one. Back in the previous century I found out that not only were Wig Wag's going for \$650 to \$850 each but the mounting brackets were even harder to find than the lights. The Wig Wag signal light has a fixed brake light and a swinging brake light that operates by engine vacuum when the brakes are applied. (Hence the name Wig Wag)

For years I had heard about a company called The Taillight Emporium which sold used lights for all makes of vehicles. Finally, one day I was able to make time & go spend most of the day perusing the inventory. For years I carried pictures in my wallet of Studebaker accessories I hoped to find. Just another sign of the terminal chrome disease! Taillight Emporium's inventory was displayed on the desert floor (DIRT) and recently had been subject to a flood! I was so excited to find a piece of a Wig Wag and even more excited when one of the owners told me he thought there were more pieces somewhere. Armed with this knowledge I searched for several hours and found all 8 to 10 pieces except the Wig Wag Corporation tag which had been reproduced by someone. Cost was \$75.

The chrome finish was very bad so I had all pieces re-chromed. I gave up on finding a correct bracket when I stumbled across one for \$1000. In order to make the light face correctly to the rear I had to make a small bracket for the bottom of light bracket. As my MOM said, "so goes life", I actually enjoy doing small fabrication.

Last thing to do was run electricity to the Wig Wag & run a vacuum line. In a rare moment of intelligence, I assembled the light & discovered that the metal flapper with leather washer would not fit in the vacuum chamber due to the re-chroming process changing the size of vacuum chamber. Oh well, the light looks good even if it will not wag! The March 1998 edition of The National Geographic on page 91 shows a 1937 President coupe with dual Wig Wags and a rumble seat. Wonder where it is now?

Another accessory I looked for & never found was fender skirts. Bruce Sandberg told me about a sheet metal fabrication shop named T A Caid. Previously they had made me 50 sets of Morris Minor spats (AKA fender skirts) & 30 pairs of 1947-50 Studebaker fender skirts. I only wanted one pair of '37 skirts, but the cost was prohibitive. Since I was a repeat customer, they agreed to make me 3 pairs. We have bought several complete cars for less money than those skirts. Lou Fencl painted them for us.

I have found 3 different pictures of a 1937 President cruising sedan with optional sunroof. I had heard rumors of an actual sunroof car being built in 1937 but never had proof until I met Mr. Richard Quinn. His Studebaker knowledge is a gold mine and his collections are incredible. One picture is taken in front of a building named Wanamaker Place and has a sign on the car roof saying Studebaker Sun-Air Top. The pictures are of two different '37 Presidents as one has a left front fender side mount spare tire with metal cover. I bet I will never find either of those cars!

It seems that all good things must come to an end. We bought the '37 in 1995 with 97,620 miles on the clock. We have driven it 31,113 which includes 3 trips to Palm Springs, Calif for the Antique Studebaker Meets put on by Frank & Kent. The hardest trip we ever made was driving the '37 to The Grand Canyon for an Antique Studebaker Meet. But it may be the most fun we ever had! I have been having trouble for some time driving the '37 and cannot work on it anymore. The last time I changed oil it took 3 days so International Drive Your Studebaker Day was our last drive in the '37. It is now at a new & good home.


