

So get a set and replace those old spark plug wires.

The Air Being Held Prisoner

In the late 60's and early 70's my wife and I started making a list of cars we would like to have and eventually the list included 2-1964 Studebakers. Mike Margerum and I were friends up to the time I tried to auction his leather jacket off at a Studebaker meet in California. Anyway, he told me that there were several '64 convertibles sold new in Pennsylvania and he knew where they were in case we were interested in a rust bucket. That car was a low priority, but we did collect a full set of sheet metal (2 doors-4 fenders-hood-trunk-rear panel, and grille panel) just in case. The other '64 we wanted was a Wagonaire and we managed to find one in the color we wanted-burgundy with burgundy interior. It was 289 V8, automatic, 4-barrel, dual pipes, PS, PB, sliding roof and split reclining front seats. We already had in our spare parts factory AC, 3RD seat, dual mirrors and stainless wind deflectors.

Speaking of spare parts, I was fortunate enough to be able to make parts runs to South Bend with Chuck Naugle in "Earl" his 2 ton military truck or with my wife in our 1 ton Transtar with 5 speed overdrive and 155 inch wheelbase. Lots of room to carry parts. There were so many parts places like Newman-Altman, Freeman-Spicer, SASCO and Dennis Lambert. It was amazing to me how many SB residents had basements-attics and garages full of NOS Studebaker parts! One of the larger places had 100's of NOS door-side and kick panels. There was no inventory of interior panels and if you wanted some they were expensive due to the amount of time it took to find the right ones. Eventually they quit selling them but if you had the time, they would let you go through the endless stacks and pick out what you wanted for \$25 each. We spent most of a day and found new panels for the Wagonaire and 2-3 other cars.

While doing research on the Wagonaire I found out that the 3 seat wagons have no spare tire (no space due to 3rd seat) and are fitted with Captive Air tires which are actually an outer nylon cord tire with an inner steel tire. The words Captive Air are neat advertising but in reality no air was held prisoner! I think (not very often according to some people) that Goodyear made most of the Captive Air tires and called them Double Eagle's. If your tire lost air, you could drive at a reasonable speed to a service station (remember service) and have it repaired. We solved our spare tire problem by purchasing a donut spare and would have placed it in the cargo area and covered it with burgundy vinyl to match the seats.

Many well laid plans of mice and men often go awry so this car did not get done. Thanks to Dee Northington for this article idea.


