

The love and care Cath shows to our community, families and most importantly our Berrimba children shines through in her love for her work.


Cath comes to Berrimba each day with a positive attitude, and a real passion to be here, doing her best and striving to provide our children with quality care.

SCHOOL HOLIDAYS BAGS A BIG SUCCESS

These holiday treats came at just the right time this summer for our kids... and our families!

A huge thank you to Kristie Hearn, who packed 150 of these showbags full of all sorts of goodies for our primary school-aged children.

Vouchers were also made available via our Youth team for kids in secondary school.

Importantly, our team is also supporting families as we head back to school for 2024.

Our School Assistance Program is designed to help contribute to the cost of children heading back to school.

Assistance worth up to \$250 is available to eligible children each year, and is available to support school-related items ONLY.

COMMUNITY GARDEN BLOOMS WITH LOVE







A previously dormant plot of land has been transformed into a thriving Indigenous community garden in a partnership between Njernda Aboriginal Corporation and the Loddon Mallee Public Health Unit (LMPHU).

The aptly named garden "Yurri Mandiga" (fresh food in Yorta Yorta language) is situated on Njernda-owned land on Goulburn Road in Echuca and aims to improve access to locally produced, fresh, healthy, plant-based food for those in need.

Njernda Healthy Lifestyles Coordinator Denise Barwick said the seven newly established garden beds are now home to an array of Indigenous plants including Cinnamon Myrtle, Aniseed Myrtle, Lemon Myrtle, Finger Limes and Davidson's Plum, in addition to non-Indigenous plants including strawberries, watermelon, cantaloupe, pumpkin, radishes, capsicums and tomatoes.

"It was really important to include the Indigenous plants, as it's a way to keep that connection to culture through these native plants," she said.

"The aim of the garden is to bring the community together, support cultural empowerment and enable education and knowledge sharing amongst the Indigenous and non-Indigenous communities.

"The garden is a really wonderful way to breathe new life into a space that was previously overrun with weeds and not very appealing to look at - now it's an oasis of beautiful fresh fruit and vegetables that will benefit many people."

Ms Barwick said the fruit and vegetable bounty will be harvested once a week and shared with community members in need.

"With the cost of living the way it is, people are really struggling," she said.

"We'll be placing the produce at the front of Njernda for people doing it tough to come along and help themselves - every little bit helps.

"We'll be working with the Youth and Justice teams as well as the Elders to come together and maintain the garden as it flourishes, which is a really nice way to connect and help out those in need."

Loddon Mallee Public Health Units Operations Manager Emma Vains said the LMPHU are "committed to supporting placed based initiatives in local communities, that meets local needs."

PROTECT YOURSELF FROM MOSQUITOES

Health Update

The recent rain has created ideal breeding conditions for mosquitoes.

We are encouraging the community to seek protection from bites and illness by:

- Covering up by wearing long, loose-fitting clothing
- Using mosquito repellents containing Picaridin or DEET
- Checking the repellent label before applying to children
- Limiting outdoor activity
- Removing stagnant water where mosquitoes can breed
- Making sure windows are fitted with mosquito netting or screens




