COMMUNITY WALK FOR RECONCILIATION WEEK

Our annual Reconciliation Community Walk was once again a huge success, bringing together people from a range of backgrounds to show their support for a common cause.

The walk, beginning at Alton Reserve and held to coincide with Reconciliation Week, drew people of all ages to participate and show solidarity with our mob.

The crowd moved down Hare Street to the Aquatic Reserve, walking behind a reconciliation banner, while also hearing from a range of speakers, taking part in a smoking ceremony and watching the raising of the Australian and Aboriginal flags.

ACCEPTANCE TREE PROJECT LAUNCHED

Njernda and Campaspe Shire Council are delighted to launch the Acceptance Tree sculpture, a powerful mixed-media installation by local Yorta Yorta artist Stuart Hearn on display at Echuca Library.

The Acceptance Tree sculpture, crafted from red gum burl, eucalyptus didgeridoo, concrete, acrylic paints and emu feathers, is a deeply symbolic piece reflecting the themes of connection, healing, and community care.



The project aims to promote inclusiveness and reconciliation by interviewing Elders and Community members about their feelings of acceptance and what it means to them in the context of their Indigenous community and the wider community. "Everybody has a desire to be wanted and needed, and to me, is the essence of acceptance," artist Stuart Hearn said.

TEAM READY TO PROTECT YOU FROM FLU

We've been running our flu clinic over the past few weeks, encouraging people to take action to protect themselves from the virus this winter.

Annual influenza vaccination is the most important measure to prevent influenza and its complications. It is recommended for all people 6 months of age and over.

Influenza vaccination is particularly important for those most at risk, with the need to improve uptake in children under 5, pregnant women and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.



KIDS COLLABORATE ON HEADSPACE ART WORK

Njernda KKE Officer Nicole Cooper and Echuca Headspace started working in April in collaboration on a community art project to install a metal art piece.

The project is One Headspace, Many Communities - A Collaborative Art Installation, and "this initiative will bring together individual language groups, reinforcing Headspace as a place of inclusivity and emotional wellbeing".

It was a combination on six sessions run over six weeks, with the support of Njernda Family Services, where kids engaged with KKE program came together to share stories, express themselves on their individual connections with country and where they would go to feel safe, and share memories that make them feel connected, safe and seen on their journeys.

Within this project we shared stories, found connection, and great pride. The project was facilitated by Allison Connelly (art therapist) at Echuca headspace, and Nicole Cooper (Njernda KKE Worker)

Finalisation has begun for the design, which will include planting around the space to prepare for the installation of the metal art piece at the entrance of Echuca Headspace at 451 High Street, Echuca.

There will be a presentation with the youth and families involved at the completion of installation, a community gathering and program evaluation.

Our young people are so excited and looking forward to seeing the result, and to show their families what they achieved!


JUL 4	Mr and Miss NAIDOC Celebrate leadership and cultural pride as we showcase the talent and aspirations of the next generation.


