

at the German Society of Pennsylvania

For over 30 years, the German Society of Pennsylvania's "Wister and More!" Concert Series has been a highlight of Philadelphia's cultural calendar. Annually, it hosts the Wister Quartet and other soloists and ensembles, showcasing a diverse spectrum of talents and internationally known musicians.

Concerts begin at 3:00 PM, inviting attendees to enjoy a delightful afternoon of music. During intermission, champagne and other refreshments are available.

Following each concert, the audience is invited to a reception in the German Society's Ratskeller. Here, amidst a warm and charming atmosphere, attendees can mingle, enjoy coffee and cake, and have the opportunity to meet the artists.

This season's chamber music line-up promises to be exceptional. Alongside perennial favorites such as the Casimir Trio, the Karlsruher Konzert-Duo, Trio Montage, Elissa Lee Koljonen and Natalie Zhu, and Claire Huangci, the series will introduce an outstanding group making their first appearance at the German Society.

New to the series will be Night Music, an ensemble dedicated to exploring and performing music of the Revolutionary era. Their repertory ranges from duos and trios to large-scale chamber works combining strings and winds, such as the imaginative symphony arrangements that were so popular around 1800, to concertos, cantatas, and concert arias.

Biographies

The Casimir Trio is a distinguished constituent chamber ensemble of 1807 & Friends consisting of Marcantonio Barone (piano), Nancy Bean (violin), and Clancy Newman (cello), and known for its captivating performances and deep commitment to classical music.

Trio Montage (Nancy Bean, violin; Anne Sullivan, harp; and Derek Barnes, cello) has been praised for its eclectic programming, performing works ranging from classical composers like Mozart to contemporary pieces, including arrangements of songs by Led Zeppelin.

Violinist Elissa Lee Koljonen and pianist Natalie Zhu—both Curtis alumnae—bring international acclaim and dynamic artistry to the stage. Koljonen has performed with top orchestras worldwide, while Zhu is a recipient of the Avery Fisher Career Grant and a frequent soloist, recitalist, and chamber musician across three continents.

Night Music is a Philadelphia-based chamber ensemble dedicated to exploring the music of the Revolutionary era. Its musicians are among the country's top players specializing in historically-informed performance, playing with and leading many prominent period-instrument ensembles.

Claire Huangci began her international career at the age of nine with concert performances and competition successes. With an irrepressible curiosity and penchant for unusual repertoire, she proves her versatility with a wide range in repertoire spanning from Bach and Scarlatti, to Bernstein, Gulda, and Corigliano.

The **Karlsruher Konzert-Duo** (Reinhard Armleder, cello; Dagmar Hartmann, piano), winner of several international competitions, is very successful and in demand in Germany and abroad. The duo is regularly highly praised for fascinating its audiences by the depth of its interpretations, its brilliant technique, and its imaginative programming choices.
