Monday, November 10, 2025 (by Marilyn Culler)

2 Peter 1:16-21 <https://tinyurl.com/2cmuf4sk>

PONDER: Prophets are among God's people today just as they have been with God's people through the ages. God speaks through those who are open to the leadings of the Holy Spirit, not those who speak on behalf of God based on their own will. We have the gift of discernment to know whether someone is speaking the wisdom of the Holy Spirit or human will. Be vigilant. False prophets are among us, working against the goodness God desires for all people.

PRAYER: Holy Spirit, be in my heart and words always as I seek to share God's message and shine God's Light in the world. Thank You. Amen.

ACTION: Ask the Holy Spirit to guide you in the words you share today.

Tuesday, November 11, 2025 (by Ashlée Vitz)

PONDER: Abraham, Moses, Rahab—each risked safety for obedience. Faith takes risks that the world calls foolish, but God calls faithful.

PRAY: Courageous God, help me trust you enough to risk obedience. Amen.

ACTION: Take one small courageous step today—make the call, speak the truth, or extend kindness.

PONDER: "The Lord of heavenly forces" – that's who I want on my side! The Lord delivered a promise and a proclamation through the prophet Zechariah – living words of encouragement and hope. The Lord also shares through the prophet what our role as the faithful family of God must be: don't be afraid; speak truth; live truthfully, justly and peaceably; do the right thing, and don't take advantage of others. The Lord cares about us and is involved in our lives. What else do we need to know to do right by God?

PRAYER: Lord of heavenly and earthly forces, guide me in Your ways all the days of my life. Amen.

ACTION: The Lord speaks through Zechariah of old people living in safety and children laughing and playing. This is not the reality for many people today. Pray for those who are needlessly suffering at the hands of the wicked as they/we wait on the Lord.

PONDER: Surrounded by witnesses, we run with perseverance, eyes fixed on Jesus. Discipline is God's loving shaping, not rejection. Our race is endurance, not sprint.

PRAY: God of the race, keep me steady and teach me through your loving discipline. Amen.

ACTION: Name one habit that slows you down spiritually. Replace it with one healthier choice.

PONDER: We approach not Sinai with fear, but Zion with joy, the city of God, with Jesus as mediator. Worship and awe shape our identity as citizens of God's kingdom.

PRAY: Lord of Zion, draw me into your presence with awe. Amen.

ACTION: Spend 2 minutes in silence, imagining worship in God's heavenly city.

Saturday, November 15, 2025 (by Lisa Trigg)

PONDER: I have a friend who likes to travel on her own. She says she doesn't get lonely, because she usually finds other Jesus believers who encourage her along the way. I asked her how, among the hundreds of people she encounters in airports and train station, she could identify Jesus believers. She said the first encounter came when someone she was chatting with in a line said, "May God's peace be with you." That became her saying as she interacted with people on her travels. Many times, it led to a faith conversation. When we encounter others who have faith in Jesus, we share a spiritual connection and we recognize the spirit of God in each person. Despite our personal differences and individuality, we can feel connected as Jesus followers just as the parts of the human body are connected. Each part has its purpose, and relies on the other parts. We, too, can find purpose and unity in our faith connections with others.

PRAYER: Dear God, thank you for creating a diverse community of people who love you and give connection to others. Amen.

ACTION: Ask others today, "How is it with your soul?" and see where the conversation leads.
