"At the mountain of God, Horeb, Elijah came to a cave, where he took shelter. Then the Lord said to him, 'Go outside and stand on the mountain before the Lord; the Lord will be passing by.' A strong and heavy wind was rending the mountain...but the Lord was not in the wind. After the wind there was an earthquake - but the Lord was not in the earthquake. After the earthquake there was a fire - but the Lord was not in the fire. After the fire there was a tiny whispering sound. When he heard this, Elijah hid his face in his cloak and stood at the entrance of the cave."

Wind, fire and earthquake are similar signs at Pentecost. In our time when so many walk with ear buds or headphones, they are either listening to something, or perhaps blocking unnecessary noise. Am I able to hear the tiny whispering sound of the Lord telling me He loves me, or directs me to assist someone else?

What can I listen to today, to learn that the Lord wants not only to pass by, but to stay with us?

In recent times we have been touched by two hurricanes, resulting in mud slides and death. We have witnessed devastating fires in the west, burning entire communities. We have watched as rescuers seek to recover victims of

earthquakes, especially in Syria and Turkey.

As we witness such disasters, we pray for the victims and support rescue efforts. We ask that all the calming hand of God may offer hope and assistance. I want to both hear and listen. From the sea of Galilee Jesus speaks and says, 'O you of little faith why did (do) you doubt?'

First Reading: 1 Kings 19:9a, 11-13a

After fleeing from the revenge of the King of Israel, Elijah hid in a cave, but at the command of God, he went outside and stood on a mountain. There the Lord came to him, not in the wind nor in the earthquake, but in a "tiny whispering sound."

Second Reading: Romans 9:1-5

Paul is deeply pained because the Jews - in spite of everything that has been given to them - have rejected Christ.

Gospel: Matthew 14:22-33

Matthew vividly recounts the event of Jesus walking on the water. When the disciples see this, they are terrified, and Jesus chastises them for their fear. Peter begs Christ to let him walk on the water; he is at first brave but begins to sink and loses faith, crying out, "Lord save me!" Christ rescues him for his faltering faith.


