FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly Most Holy Name Catholic Church, Garfield, NJ Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time September 17, 2023

"Forgive your neighbor's injustice; then when you pray, your own sins will be forgiven. Could anyone nourish anger against another and expect healing from the Lord? Could anyone refuse mercy to another like himself, can he seek pardon for his own sins... and overlook faults... 'Lord if my brother sins against me how often must I forgive?'"

We recite the Lord's prayer and state that we will receive forgiveness, perhaps only when we forgive others. The reading from Sirach sets the tone. Not only are we to forgive, but we are called to discover ways to initiate the action.

One of the greatest powers we possess is the power to forgive. We can do so or withhold this gift when someone asks. We can offer it before it is sought, when we realize how generous and merciful is our God to us. The adage 'forgive and forget' is nice, but difficult. A wonderful monk taught me, 'forgive and remember without bitterness.'

#### First Reading: Sirach 27:30—28:7


Sirach advises all to forgive the faults of their neighbor. Only by forgiving the sins of others, can a person expect to be forgiven his sins.

## Second Reading: Romans 14:7-9

Paul stresses that no one is his own master; we are responsible to the Lord, and we belong to him in both life and death.

#### Gospel: Matthew 18:21-35

This narrative points out the difference between mercy and justice. When Peter asks how often he should forgive someone who wrongs him, Jesus answers, "...not seven times: I say seventy times seven times." Jesus then narrates the story of the king who was merciful to his official by forgiving him all his debts, but this same official showed no mercy to his own servant.


