They're here to help you understand the story of a man from the bible that we've been learning about this week, named Joseph, who not only had a gift from God to interpret dreams, but we also see how God worked through Joseph's life to make dreams come true that He couldn't even imagine possible. Okay VISTO Visions, here we go.

TABLEAUX 1: Jacob had 12 sons, his favourite one was Joseph. His favouritism was no secret. In fact, to advertise it, he gave his son Joseph a fancy coat of many colours.

TABLEAUX 2: This made Joseph's brothers feel second class and jealous of him. Joseph would bring bad reports to his father about what his brothers were doing, and then Joseph would share his dreams with them, dreams that suggested he was going to rule over them one day.

TABLEAUX 3: Now his brothers grew even more jealous, they decided to get rid of him for good. They settled on selling him for twenty pieces of silver to merchants who were heading to Egypt.

TABLEAUX 4: In Egypt, Joseph was sold as a slave to Potiphar, who was one of Pharaoh's officials. God was with Joseph and soon Potiphar became very fond of him and put him in charge of all his personal affairs.

TABLEAUX 5: Things seemed to be looking up for Joseph, but it wasn't long lasting. Joseph had an encounter with Potiphar's wife that put him in a sticky situation, and though Joseph was innocent, Potiphar was so angry that he threw Joseph in jail.

TABLEAUX 6: But that wasn't the end of Joseph's story. Even in Jail, Joseph was faithful to God and used his gifts to interpret the dreams of two men alongside him. One was Pharaoh's head baker and the other was Pharaoh's head cupbearer.

TABLEAUX 7: As Joseph had said, the cupbearer was released from jail and working for Pharaoh again in 3 days. Joseph asked the cupbearer to remember His name and to tell Pharaoh about him, that he might be free from jail.

TABLEAUX 8: Pharaoh told Joseph his dreams, and Joseph explained that God had revealed that there would be seven years of plenty followed by seven years of famine. Joseph recommended Pharaoh prepare during the good years, storing food for the difficult times ahead.

TABLEAUX 9: Pharaoh saw that God was with Joseph and recognized his wisdom. So, Pharaoh put Joseph in charge of all of Egypt, trusting him to lead and prepare the land.

TABLEAUX 10: Just as Joseph had said, the famine came. But Egypt was ready. Because Joseph had trusted God and used his gifts, people had food- and lives were saved. But, far away, Joseph's family began to feel the effects of the famine. His brothers came to Egypt looking for food and they didn't recognize Joseph.

TABLEAUX 11: After testing them, Joseph finally revealed who he was. The same brother they had once betrayed...was now the one who could help them.

FINAL TABLEAUX 12: Instead of anger, Joseph chose forgiveness. He welcomed his family, and they were reunited. What others meant for harm, God used for good. Joseph's dream didn't happen right away. But through trust, patience, and faith, God used his life to help others in ways he never could have imagined.
