and for this we shall praise You forever.

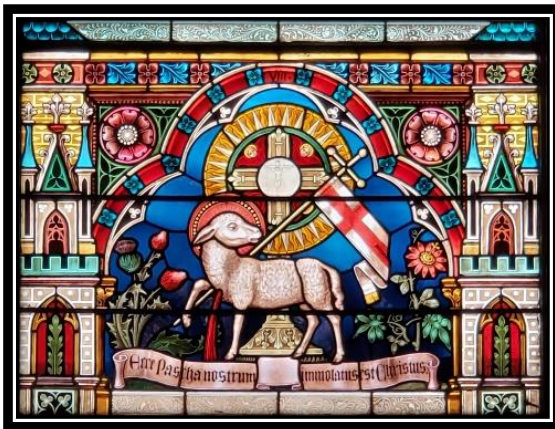



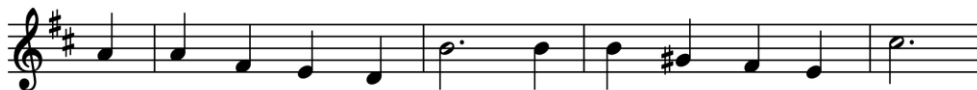
