us to serve as Your Son, Jesus served.

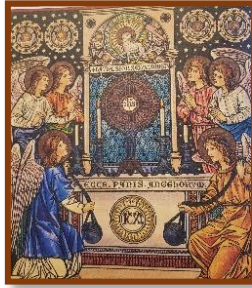

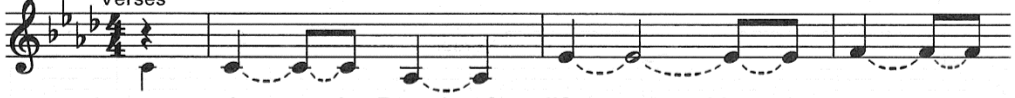

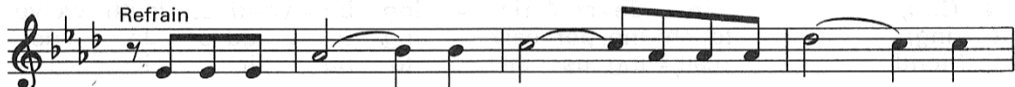
