women will open their hearts to Your loving plan.

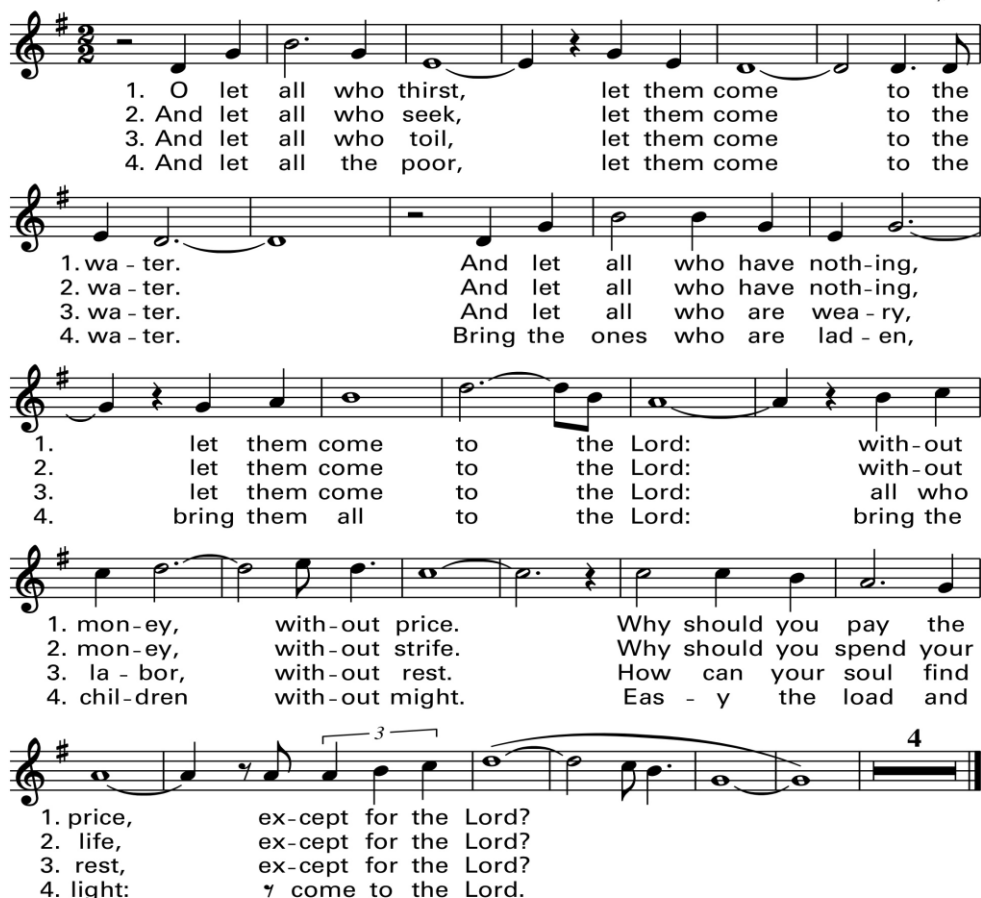
We pray especially for those whom You are calling

Since I cannot now receive You Sacramentally,

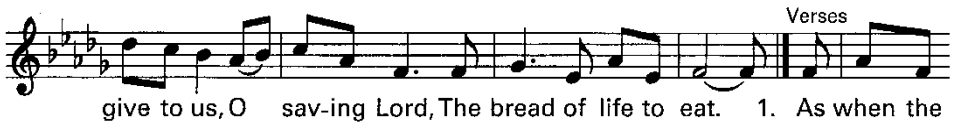
