

#### PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS


Loving God, You have made us in Your image and likeness, and for this we shall praise You forever.

#### ACT OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION PRAYER


My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the most Blessed Sacrament. I love you above all things and I desire to receive You into my soul.

Pray for us, O holy Mother of God Ry. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.


