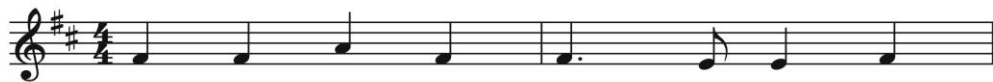
ACT OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION PRAYER

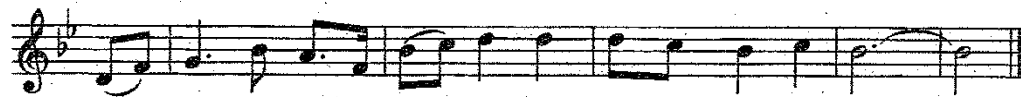
