The Palmyra City Council met on the above date in the Palmyra Council Chambers at 7:00 p.m. with Mayor Alan R. Adrian presiding. Mayor Adrian opened the meeting with an Invocation. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and the following council members answered roll call: Steve Bland, Clay Thornburg, Earl Meyers, Rex Thomas (via TEAMS), Brock Fahy, and Zach Jones. Also in attendance were Austen Dornberger, Mike Baker, Kyle Brennemann, Eddie Kamm, and James Lemon.

A motion was made by Council Member Bland and seconded by Council Member Jones to approve the agenda as presented. The roll call vote was as follows: Ayes: Bland, Thornburg, Meyers, Thomas, Fahy, and Jones. Nays: None. The motion carried.

Council Member Meyers reported quotes he has obtained for budgeting purposes. One quote was for the plaster repair and repaint of City Hall and the other quote was for the replacement of the fence at the Recycle Center.

Council Member Fahy advised representatives from Brownfield will be in town on February 23<sup>rd</sup> to view properties eligible for grant funds received through the Marion-Ralls Regional Port Authority. Fahy also mentioned that he and Mayor Adrian will be attending the MML Legislative Conference in the upcoming weeks.

Council Member Fahy advised that the Heimer Construction bid for the kitchen remodel at the Sesquicentennial Building will be placed on the February 19<sup>th</sup> agenda for acceptance. Fahy reported he and Parks Director Meyers had spoken and even though no one wants to cut corners on the project, the funding is currently not available to do the entire project. There is a plan to continue to make additional modifications with the assistance of clubs and event holders.

Mayor Adrian advised he attended a TDD meeting held on February 3<sup>rd</sup>. The meeting was a kickoff to a campaign to educate the community about transportation needs in the area and answer questions about the TDD as this will be placed on a ballot for a vote of the people.

A motion was made by Council Member Bland and seconded by Council Member Jones to enter closed session pursuant to Section 610.021(1)(3)(13), RSMo. and admit the council, City Attorney James Lemon, and City Clerk Deena Parsons. The roll call vote was as follows: Ayes: Bland, Thornburg, Meyers, Thomas, Fahy, and Jones. Nays: None. The motion carried. Visitors left the meeting and the council entered closed session at 7:23 p.m.
