Botter means wines since 1928. A wide range of products, many of which are made with grapes from native vines in order to underline the multi-territorial approach that spans the whole of Italy, from the North to the South. Pale light yellow in colour with typical crisp and delicate perlage, Botter prosecco has a bouquet with fruity notes of peach and green apple with scents of acacia and lilac. Fresh and light on the palate, with balanced acidity and body offers a harmonic and a long persistent aftertaste.

Botter, Casa Vinicola, Rose

Another great addition from Casa Botter, this prosecco has a light rosé colour with a wonderful elegant and intense bouquet. Dry, soft and well-balanced on the palate; round and full-bodied structure with fruity notes.

Biscardo Prosecco Millesimato

Veneto, Italy

A carefully crafted vintage Prosecco of the highest quality coming from the Biscardo Family, whom have been making wine from their base in Soave for over 150 years. Aromatic, delicate aromas of apple and honeysuckle is ideal as an aperitif and but also excellent to accompany an entire meal, especially fish.

A symbol of champagne tradition, Yannick Prevateau Carte d'Or is a family owned and run vineyard in Damery near Epernay. This champagne, produced from the 3 classic grape varieties in equal parts, is a fabulous champagne with depth and complexity, a well-rounded palate, good fruit and a fine mousse.

Cremant de Bourgogne Veuve Ambal

Pale yellow gold in colour, the Veuve Ambal Cremant de Bourgogne shows an exceptionally fine, persistent mousse with a delicate sparkle. The fruity nose offers citrus aromas, and the palate is dominated by notes of lemon and lime which give it a nice, fresh texture and a long finish, crisp and dry.

Veuve Clicquot, Yellow Label, Brut

Yellow Label is the signature of Veuve Clicquot's quality and style, recreated every year thanks to their priceless collection of reserve wines. It manages to reconcile two opposing factors - strength and silkiness - and to hold them in perfect balance with aromatic intensity and a lot of freshness. This consistent power to please makes it ideal as an aperitif, and perfect as the Champagne to enjoy with a meal.

Laurent Perrier, Brut

France NV

Laurent Perrier has become one of the great Champagne names by achieving a consistently high standard. This delightful wine has a pale golden colour and fine citrus notes in the bouquet, confirmed on the palate, followed by a slight yeastiness and some biscuity flavours. Like all good champagne it has an exhilarating finish.

Bollinger Special Cuvee, Brut

France NV

A hedonist's dream from one of the great Champagne houses. Golden in colour, with very fine bubbles like velvet, the Special Cuvee presents a beautiful aromatic complexity: ripe fruit and spicy aromas, hints of roasted apples and peaches. On the palate, a subtle combination of structure, length and vivacity, pear, brioche and spicy aromas with notes of fresh walnut.

Laurent Perrier Cuvee Rosé, Brut **£134**

France NV

Salmon-pink in colour, it has hints of soft red fruits, such as strawberries, redcurrants, raspberries and black cherries. Intensely fruity flavours begin clean and well-defined upon entry, the wine then opens up to provide a mélange of flavours consisting of fresh strawberries, raspberries and wild cherries. It has great length and is rounded and supple on the finish. Revered by wine-lovers for its flavour, and by aesthetes for the beauty of its 17th century-style bottle dating back to Henry V, the cuvée Rosé Brut is one of the stars in the Laurent-Perrier range.

Taittinger, Comtes de Champagne, Blanc de Blancs **£480**

France

The 2006 Comtes de Champagne is striking, especially in the way it brings together elements of ripeness and freshness in a hypothetical blend of the 2002 and 2004. Smooth and creamy on the palate, the 2006 is all about texture. There is a real feeling of density and weight in the 2006, qualities that will grow with time in the bottle. All the elements fall into place effortlessly. Citrus fruits and fragrant honeysuckle on the nose; then the coup de grace of a weightlessly elegant mouthfeel that is so Comtes, with richer fruits like apricot and white pear following on. Delicate aeration encourages a note of oak.

Krug Vintage, Champagne **£845**

France

Krug 1998 offers astonishing purity, elegance and a very long finish. Characterized by the warm glow of yellow gold and the fragrant aroma of flowers in bloom, Krug 1998 is a champagne of purity and precision. Expressive aromas of bread, hazelnut and orange peel develop into flavours of citrus fruits, dried fruits and gingerbread. This vintage is known as homage au Chardonnay as it is only second Krug vintage after 1981, where Chardonnay dominates.

Banat, Romania

The first records of viticulture in the Banat region date back from the period of the Roman invasion of Dacia, in the early 245 AD. This wine shows opulent aromas of grapefruit and peach that follow through to the palate and combine with melon, green apples and citrus fruit.

Andersbrook Chenin Blanc **£7/9/11** **£31**

Western Cape, South Africa

Andersbrook Chenin blanc is an elegant example of this type of grape variety coming from the heart of the Cape Winelands. It is a fresh, dry Chenin with citrus aromas leading to orchard and tropical fruits on the palate, well balanced by crisp acidity.

Chardonnay, Calmel & Joseph **£7.5/9.5/12** **£34**

Languedoc, France

This beautiful variety of Chardonnay has very expressive aromas with stone fruit such as apricot or peach, evolving to floral notes of acacia blossom and aniseed. It is well balanced on the palate with fresh, fruity and round notes and a delicious minerality which is the signature of this wine from one vintage to the next. It is softly oaky and has a very harmonious finish which remains superbly fresh.

Sauvignon Blanc, Kukupa **£8/10/13** **£38**

Marlborough, New Zealand

Kukupa Sauvignon Blanc comes from the prized coastal vineyards at Dillons Point in north Marlborough. Named after the bird that eats fermenting fruit becoming a bit tipsy. Fresh and deliciously crisp with excellent natural acidity and a long citric and peach aftertaste as well as a rounded body and good structure.

Medium-Sweet, Three Choirs **£29**

Gloucestershire, England

A full and well balanced, floral wine with aromas of grapefruit. On the palate the ripe citrus and hints of crisp English apple and honey combine to give a fresh acidity and leave a clean mouth-watering finish. Three Choirs Vineyards produce a range of award-winning English wines using modern viticultural methods and winemaking techniques.

- Chardonnay, Tooma River** **£32**
South Eastern Australia
Exclusively produced for the UK, this wine delivers a vibrant fruity style. Notes of lime, grapefruit and melon all bound up with a zesty, crisp citrus balance which cuts through the finish. A deliciously refreshing glass by itself or paired with full flavoured fish and more.
- Muscadet, Château de la Bretèche** **£33**
Loire, France
This Muscadet variety is coming from Chateau de la Bretesche, an estate with a long history dating back to 1387. The wine has elegance and complexity, with high acidity yet good concentration of flavours. An authentic "gastronomic dry wine".
- Picpoul de Pinet, Duc de Morny** **£35**
Languedoc, France
Relatively recently incorporated in 1992, its history dates back to 1922, Cave de l'Ormarine is an award-winning co-operative which produces wines from the tiny Pinet appellation in the Hérault. Duc de Morny Picpoul de Pinet is a fine, elegant and incredibly fruity Picpoul with a very long finish. Nicknamed 'la bomba' this is an ideal match for fish and shellfish.
- Godello, Mara Moura** **£38**
Monterrei, Galicia, Spain
In Galicia, near to the border with Portugal this structured, balanced white enjoys a palate of white fruit and strong minerality. An aroma bursting with floral fragrances, minerality and notes of balsamic with a long finish, this is a wine worth of its legendary name sake. Cool climate Spain is arguably producing some of the best fresh white styles in the world.
- Muscat Ottonel, Medium Sweet** **£42**
Curtea Regala, Romania
Coming from the official supplier of the Romanian Royal House, Muscat Ottonel wine has an intense, attractive yellow colour, which turns into golden as the wine grows old. It is the grape's aroma that gives the wine its special Muscat flavour. Rich, balanced, with a pleasant roundness and softness, the wine has everything he needs and that special something that makes it different from other white wines.
- Rioja Blanco, Luis Canas, Barrel Fermented** **£45**
Rioja, Spain
A beautifully balanced example of white Rioja that straddles the styles of the old and the new. Vibrant citrusy Viura is blended with the weightier Malvasia and the brief barrel maturation adds a honeyed roundness to the crisp lemony fruit. Beautiful golden yellow colour with bright lemon-tinted reflections. Elegant, combining hints of flowers, fruits and hazelnuts. Dry, with just enough acidity to make it fresh and lively with a structured and tasty finish of ripe fruit.
- Fume, Budureasca, Premium Collection** **£45**
Romania
Coming from Budureasca wines vineyard which has won over 300 medals at international competitions, the award-winning Premium Fume is a blend of Chardonnay, Sauvignon Blanc and Pinot Gris carefully created to obtain the perfect balance. Straw yellow in colour with exotic aromas of tropical fruit add to the bouquet. The taste is fresh and very complex, with accents of vanilla bean and quince. The palate is delicate with pleasant acidity before a smooth, consistent finish.
- Grüner Veltliner, Pfaffl, Austrian Pepper** **£46**
Niederösterreich, Austria
Weingut Pfaffl Austrian Pepper Gruner Veltliner from the Niederösterreich region in Austria really tickles the tongue with white pepper spice followed by lively citrus fruit. Lovely soft texture in the mouth with a fresh, clean finish.
- Adelaide White, Peter Lehmann Layers** **£45**
Australia
The wine is pale yellow with a youthful green hue. On the nose, there are aromas of citrus, peach and white flowers with a hint of lifted spice. The finely structured, lemon-tinged Semillon supports the soft floral aromatics of Muscat and the delicate spice of Gewürztraminer. The Pinot Gris provides texture and mouthfeel to the mid-palate and the finish is crisp and fresh.
- Albariño, Pazo Torrado** **£47**
Rias Baixas, Spain
Imagine a mixture of white and yellow peaches fully ripe and aromatic mixed in with shavings of dried apricots and fresh pineapple, all sprinkled with zest lime juice. Then bottle it! It's got fruit but also this amazing acidity that totally refreshes. One of the best Albariño's with many medals.

- Riesling, Paulingshof** **£56**
Mosel, Germany
This is a classic Mosel Riesling with a fresh lemony fragrance on the nose. Amazingly complex palate with medium sweetness, structured acidity and very long finish. Low in alcohol.
- Sancerre, Domaine des Brosses** **£58**
France
Domaine des Brosses Sancerre wine is bright and pale golden. A fresh, citrus palate with herbaceous notes of hay and nettle. Richly textured but with crisp acidity and textbook minerality. The finish is elegant with the typical purity and refreshment of excellent Sancerre.
- Petit Chablis, Olivier Trincon** **£58**
A bright, elegant Petit Chablis with traditional crisp minerality and refreshing citrus-like acidity. Dry wine but beautifully balanced.
- Pinot Gris, Trimbach** **£59**
Alsace, France
One of the most remarkable wines from Alsace combines a strong fruitiness, heady, being on the dry side as it' so typical for the region. Elegant and lovely pinot gris, full flavoured with hints of butter but without austerity.
- Viognier Cuilleron** **£61**
Northern Côtes du Rhône, France
Outstanding example of the grape from Colline Rhodanienne, by one of the top producers in the Northern Rhone Appellation, Condrieu that makes the best Viognier. A flattering wine with white flowers and apricots 'aromas. Juicy and fresh on the palate, with a discreet lick of oak, acidulous finish with dry apricots notes. - a model of richness and restraint.
- Chablis 1er Cru Les Forets, Domaine Louis Michel** **£71**
France
This dry premier cru "Forêts" from Domaine Louis Michel, is characteristically lean and chiselled yet has a breathtaking complexity. And always, underneath everything, is a strong minerality. Lovely balance of lemony crispness and full, nutty richness.
- Chenin Blanc, FMC Ken Forrester,** **£110**
South Africa
The flagship wine, The FMC has a beautifully defined, intoxicating bouquet with lemon curd, frangipane, almond and just a touch of nutmeg. The palate has a rounded, waxy texture with wonderful harmony and precision. Rich, layered with dried apricot, vanilla and honey, this wine is a sublime expression of South African Chenin Blanc.
- Meursault, Michel Gaunoux,** **£116**
France
Delightful Meursault that is the definition of good Burgundy - stylish and elegant. Well developed with ripe, tropical fruit on the nose and an enticing note of honey leading to an intense and concentrated palate with well-balanced acidity and a crisp, clean, lengthy finish.

Woodchester Valley Vineyard was first planted in 2007 by the Shiner family, starting with a single acre plot in Amberley in the Cotswolds. They specialise in estate-made wines, having built their winery on site in 2016. This varietal rose is a flavoursome, dry pink wine with raspberry and strawberry aromas and a zingy, crisp palate full of punchy waxed lemons, bittersweet grapefruit and tangy rhubarb, rounding out in a soft and refreshing finish

Mas Amor, Franck Massard
Catalunya, Spain

Más Amor or More Love echoes the liveliness of Barcelona. Displaying an intense colour, aromatically it echoes citrus fruits and wild strawberries. A wine with a noticeable but pleasant acidity, light and fresh with intense citric notes like lime and grapefruit, red cherries and peppermint leaves.

Ch. Sainte Marguerite Rose, Organic, Cru Classe,
France

A Clear and bright pearly pink; packed with aromas of fresh vine fruits, plumb and nuances of guava and papaya. Its aroma and flavours fully illustrate the freshness and the benefits of organic agriculture and affirming the Cru Classé des Côtes-de-Provence appellation. Fresh, but with good mid-palate, round in the mouth and silky.

With a lovely, ruby-red colour, this wine has an intense bouquet, featuring harmonious fruits flavours with hints of spices. It is soft on the palate, with good backbone and balance, as well as velvety tannins.

Sicily, Italy

Mandrarossa is coming from the south -west of Sicily, unspoilt region of outstanding beauty. Intense and dark in colour, has a strong nose of cherry, plums and red apple with a waft of gingery spice. The palate shows ripe, plummy fruit but with a soft and gentle tannin. Ripe, almost stewed fruit flavours linger on the long finish.

Estate Malbec, Humberton Canale

Patagonia, Argentina

Humberto Canale Estate Malbec embodies the purest expression of the Patagonian terroir and the Argentine Malbec. It shows off a very refined style, both in the nose and in the mouth. Its careful oak cask ageing gives the wine an ultimate dimension that turns it into an irresistible one. This is a characteristic Malbec varietal, a full-bodied wine, with a complex structure, with surprising notes of red berries, eucalyptus, spice and black pepper.

Pedrera Monastrell

Jumilla, Spain

Produced at 700 m altitude, this young unoaked wine has appealing aromas of dark red cherry and ripe plum. A bright, fruit-forward style with pure bramble and mocha characters, rounded tannins and wonderfully smooth in the mouth.

Shiraz, The Opportunist, Wild & Wilder

Langhorne Creek, Australia

A homage to those who, no matter the weather, see blue skies, sunshine and possibility, The Opportunist Shiraz is produced from grape on their way up towards ripeness. Packed with an aromatic bouquet of ripe fruit, cherry and blackcurrant; notes of fresh ground coffee, dark chocolate and peppermint this shiraz is smooth and luxurious with a balanced fruit weight.

Nero D'avola, Vigneti Zabu,

£36

Sicily, Italy

Nero d'Avola is the flagship red grape variety of the Mediterranean island of Sicily and makes wines with a deep colour, good body and ripe, sweet fruit. This delicious example from Vigneti Zabu is an unoaked version made from young vines, well balanced, with lots of fresh black fruits, violets, spice, and soft, supple tannins and has a nice weight to it.

Kaiken Terroir, Cabernet Sauvignon/Malbec/Petit Verdot

Argentina

This elegant blend exhibits the best of each variety used and, is a deep red in colour with shades of ruby. On the nose, it displays ripe red fruit reminiscent of plums and cherries intertwined with black fruit, spices, chocolate and coffee aromas from the blending process and French oak ageing. On the palate, the unmistakable power of Petit Verdot provides firm tannins that linger. Fruity flavours appear once more leading to an elegant finish with a soft texture.

'Vinha Grande' Douro Tinto

Casa Ferreirinha, Portugal

Vinha Grande is the second oldest wine of the Douro Valley (behind Barca Velha) and its heritage is noticeable in every sip. An elegant, complex wine with the structure of a fine Bordeaux exhibiting flavours of blackcurrant, leather and subtle oak spice.

Feteasca Neagra, Curtea Regala, **£38**

Macin, Romania

The grapes of Fetească Neagră, harvested in the cold mornings of late autumn from the vineyards located at the foot of the Măcin Mountains are the raw material for this authentic Romanian wine that completes the Royal Court range. The wine is defined by the red colour with purplish hues, a rich texture, velvety with fresh tannins, which carries your perceptions from blackcurrants or dried almonds to light shades of dark chocolate.

Finca Manzanos Rioja Crianza **£38**

Rioja, Spain

On the border between Rioja and Navarra, Victor Manzanos carries on the work of the four generations before him. Adding in significant amounts of ambition and energy, Victor Manzanos is at the forefront of the new Rioja - championing a modern interpretation of its varieties through his wines. Packed with pure red berry fruit balanced by vanilla oak and a hint of spice.

Montresor "Urban Park" Appassimento **£39**

Veneto, Italy

An appealing appassimento style red from the Veneto - produced from classic Amarone della Valpolicella grapes, Corvina, Corvinone and Rondinella. Harvested from hillside vineyards north of Verona. The wine has bright berry and black cherry aromas, and a touch of spice. The palate has all Valpolicella's appealing fresh cherry and ripe bramble fruit, along with added weight and complexity from maturation in oak. Supple tannins lead to a finish of delicate sweetness, offset by fresh acidity.

Château des Gravieres **£39**

Bordeaux, France

With many prizes won, this deep garnet-red wine, has a slightly woody and toasty nose and aromas of prunes and liquorice. Fleshy robust and well balanced in the mouth with a firm, lengthy finished.

Côtes du Rhône **£43**

Chuslan, France

Chuslan wines have a long-standing reputation. Being praised since the 17th century and being granted the Côtes du Rhone Villages status in 1971. Wine with a deep black colour and a brilliant brightness. The aromatic expression is powerful and concentrated without any excess on high class fruitiness. The sweet tannin structure gives a soft and elegant mouthfeel to the wine.

Anarkia Tannat **£45**

Uruguay

Tannat has become the signature grape of Uruguay. Powerful palate, with flavours of blackberries, delicate smokiness, and a long intense finish of dark fruits. Firm and polished tannins giving a true Tannat expression. Los Vientos Anarkia Tannat is made with no added sulphur and indigenous yeasts giving a full-bodied rich wine with concentrated pure fruit.

Pinot Noir, De Loach, Heritage Reserve **£47**

California, USA

A Californian vineyard with a Burgundian winemaking philosophy. This Californian Pinot Noir is an elegant and well-balanced wine. Offering mouth-watering flavours of cherry and strawberry, it is accented beautifully with just a touch of spice and earthiness.

Primitivo, Lirica **£49**

Manduria, Puglia, Italy

Coming from Manduria, the home of Primitivo wines, Lirica is a medium ruby red colour with a pure nose of ripe dark fruits, cherry, plum and sweet spices like ginger and aniseed supported with discreet oak. The palate is round and textured with a well-balanced freshness and elegant tannin, ending with a long and broad spicy finish.

Arabesque, Domaine de Montvac **£51**

Vacqueras, France

Balance in elegance is what this wine offers. A balance of flavours, with three complementary varieties: Grenache, Syrah and Mourvèdre. The elegance of a delicate, thoroughbred structure that underscores a continuum of perceptions: presence, then roundness, and persistence. Pure, intense yet delicate aromas of redcurrant and licorice, without oak. Structure very elegant with fine tannin and balanced acidity.

- Terrasses du Larzac, Calmel & Joseph** **£56**
Languedoc, France
Carmel Joseph Terrasses du Larzac is a special wine from this prized small area within the Languedoc. A blend of Mourvedre, Syrah and Grenache, this is an intense wine with notes of red and black berry fruit such as redcurrant, blackcurrant and elderberry. Full, yet balanced and complex with mineral notes on the long finish. An atypical Terrasses du Larzac in the continuity of the style of previous vintages with an international silver medal.
- Nebbiolo D'alba, Marne Burne** **£64**
Fontanafredda, Italy
Nebbiolo Marne Burne stands out for its fragrance which is confirmed on the nose by bouquets of flowers and wild fruit, and on the palate by its strong personality and dry, nicely almond-like taste. A deep ruby red Nebbiolo wine with faint garnet tints.
- Rully Rouge, 1er Cru Clos du Chapitre** **£65**
Burgandy, France
Fine, elegant and structured, the Clos du Chapitre shows a very Burgundian expression of Pinot Noir. Aromas of red fruit dominate the nose with violets and cherry in abundance. Fine, supple tannins and a refreshing acidity on the palate make this a truly remarkable bottle of Pinot.
- Negru de Purcari,** **£67**
Moldova
"The Queen of England's favourite wine" by Joe Fattorini. This is the proud boast of Negru de Purcari on account of multiple purchases of the 1990 vintage by Buckingham Palace. An intriguing blend of 70% Cab. Sauvignon, 20% Saperavi, the deeply coloured and ancient red grape of Georgia and 10% the native Moldovan Rara Neagra. The wine is a deep ruby colour with a mix of red and black fruits character together with spice from its three-year sojourn in French oak barrels. Full-bodied and with ample if ripe and fine-grained tannins, and some beguiling earthy notes from its bottle age.
- Gigondas, Domaine Brusset** **£69**
Côtes du Rhone, France
Despite its youth, Gigondas Tradition it's such a vibrant wine in dense carmine dress with purple reflections. On the nose, an explosion of black fruits, mineral notes and vanilla. In the mouth, a silky texture, round tannins and a nice freshness.
- Marquis des Beys** **£71**
Bekaa Valley, Lebanon
Domaine des Tourelles is one of the longest established and most highly acclaimed wineries in the Bekaa Valley, Lebanon. Marquis des Beys Red is an exquisite Cabernet Syrah blend from one of the Bekaa Valley's leading producers. Oak ageing gives a soft, rounded yet powerful wine with bramble fruit and spicy, chocolatey notes and fine tannins.
- Pommard 'Les Perrieres', Jean-Michel Gaunoux** **£85**
Côte de Beaune, Bourgogne, France
Vibrant and bright with just a hint of mahogany; aromas of wild berries, black fruits and spice blossom from beautiful representation of the Pommard AOC. A medium bodied palate gives a complex flavour combination of strawberries and cherry with background notes of mushroom and earthy forest floor. With intense tannins and mouthwatering acids this Pommard lends itself to a lengthy, firm and clean finish.
- Barolo Fontanafredda** **£98**
Barolo, Piedmont, Italy
