I. HOW DOES THE PROGRAMME WORK

I.I LEARNING ENGLISH AT A PACT SCHOOL

PACT International organises English programmes for school children aged from 10-18. They can choose to stay for a term or a year. We also have an option of staying for two years if joining the Sixth Form.

Students will be in classes with approximately 20 students of the same age. They will follow the UK curriculum and they will be treated in the same way as any other student in the school and are expected to behave accordingly.

1.2 SUBJECTS

International students will do the same subjects as their UK classmates, including homework, projects and

At secondary level, the only subject they will be exempt from doing will be the modern foreign language studied in their year (either Spanish or French). During this time they will be given additional English lessons or be expected to work on their English homework.

1.3 BOOKS

Students will be provided with textbooks (on a loan basis) and notebooks. They must bring their own writing materials (pens, rulers, pencils etc.) and a calculator.

I.4 TRANSPORT

Students will either walk to school, get a lift by car or take public transport (bus, tram, train) depending on where the host family live. PACT International will provide the student with an Oyster Card which will cover all their travel. If a student loses the travel card, PACT International will apply for a replacement which will incur a cost of £20, payable by the student. The new travel card may take a few days to arrive and the student will need to pay for his/her travel during this period.

1.5 PUPIL INDUCTION AND SUPPORT

Upon arriving at the school, the form teacher or Head of Section will meet with the pupils to discuss the main school procedures (e.g. who the Designated Safeguarding Leads (DSLs) are and what to do if they have a concern or need personal guidance; behaviour expectations including rewards and sanctions; code of pupil responsibility; school ethos; etc.). PACT Schools have high standards of discipline and international students must abide by the school's rules at all times.

I.6 UNIFORM

The Cedars – the boys can wear the school uniform from their school of origin as long as it includes long trousers, tie and a blazer. They can also bring their PE Kit but they will need to buy the games kit (rugby, football or cricket, depending on the term). The cost of this will be added to the invoice.

The Laurels – the girls need to wear the full school uniform and sports kit which can be purchased online from Stevensons. www.stevensons.co.uk

If they are staying for just one term they can rent it from the PACT International uniform bank at a cost of £80 per term. This will be added on to the invoice for the term.

Oakwood and Oliver house – any boys or girls joining either of our primary schools for a term will be required to wear the full school uniform which PACT International will provide.

1.7 HALF TERM HOLIDAY PERIODS

All international students are asked to stay in England during the half term holiday period. Host families arrange their activities during this period taking into account that the student will be staying with them.

1.8 TRIPS AND CLUBS

Trips organised by the schools are included in the fees except for the residential trips. These are not compulsory and must be paid forseparately. Most of the extracurricular clubs held at the schools are free althought there are some (e.g. speech & drama, intrument tuition etc) which are not included in the school fees. The fees for these clubs will be invoiced separately, directly to parents by the peripatetic teacher giving the lesson.

2. APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

2.1 APPLICATION PROCEDURE

All international students should send in their application form with their latest report and a reference letter from their headmaster/mistrees, tutor or teacher. PACT International staff may contact the foreign student's current school for further references.

When the availability of a place at the school has been confirmed, based on the academic report and on the reference letter, a registration deposit of £1000 must be paid as soon as possible.

On receiving the registration deposit PACT International will look for a suitable host family. If PACT International is unable to find a host family, or the hosting arrangement needs to be cancelled, the deposit will be refunded. However, any additional costs incurred (e.g. flights) will not be refunded. If the student does not take up the place, the deposit will not be refunded unless there unless under extreme circumstances which will be determined on a case by case basis.

The family will need to send in a signed Consent Form, Family Information Form, a photo of the students passport and another passport like photo (of the student against a white background) for their Travelcard.

2.2 MEDICAL ISSUES AND INSURANCE

Parents will be asked to provide information about their child's health, medical and dietary need and this will be passed on to the host family.

All students must bring with them an EHIC (European Health Insurance Card). This covers any emergency treatment the students receive whilst in the UK or, if not in the EU, private health insurance cover must be provided.

3. HOST FAMILY INFORMATION

Host families will either be known to PACT as members of the school community (e.g. current or past parents, staff etc.), or will be recommended by someone known to the school. Any background checks will be carried out as deemed necessary. They are selected based on friendliness, trustworthiness and their moral values.

PACT International will carry out a home visit before any foreign pupil is allocated to a host family, with a review every two years. PACT International will ensure that the environment in the home is comfortable, safe and clean. Students will be treated like another member of the family and are expected to behave accordingly. They must abide by the same rules as the child of their age.

Should the international student not stay for the length of the agreed period of study, no refund will be made, except under exceptional circumstances, which will be determined on a case by case basis.

4. TUTOR

Each international student is assigned a personal tutor who guides them on their personal growth in character while also tracking their academic results. The tutor meets with the student once a fortnight. They will contact the parents regularly to discuss the student progress and are always available if there are any issues that need to be discussed.

A PACT International employee (Nuria or Belen) will also visit the children once a week at school where they will be encouraged to raise any concerns they may have and discuss anything they may need help with.

5. REPORTING TO PARENTS

International students will receive the same reports as current school pupils. This is usually a termly report, which will be sent to parents either by post or email at the end of term.

6. WEEKENDS

International students spend their weekends with their host family.

Once a month, PACT International will organise a full day excursion to a place of cultural interest (including galleries and museums) in London in addition to a termly outing to a West End musical. All of these trips are included in the termly fee.

7. POCKET MONEY

Students do not need much pocket money since everything is generally provided. We recommend and average of £10 - £15 per week.

8. CAMBRIDGE ENGLISH LANGUAGE EXAMS

International students attending The Cedars or The Laurels will have a language test when they arrive and will be entered into a Cambridge exam, suitable for their level, at the end of the term. The tuition costs are included in the PACT International fee but a £150 examination fee will be added to the students invoice. Students will be expected to keep up with any homework set during their additional language classes.

9. ELECTRONIC DEVICES

We strongly recommend that students do not bring andy electronic devices such as tablets, smart phones, iPods and laptops when coming to England. This will ensure that they are not hindered from socialising and integrating with the host family. We do not guarantee that there will be internet access at the host family house and if there is, we advise our host families that they should limit internet access and supervise it at all times.

A simple phone, without internet access, which can only be used for calls and messages, should be sufficient for their stay in England.

If a student does bring an electronic device (including a smartphone) with does create a problem either fro the school or the host family, or impedes the students integration, we reserve the right to confiscate it until they return home.

II. BOOKING FLIGHTS

Parents are asked to arrange flights to and from Gatwick Airport. Host families will pick up the international students from the airport if they travel unaccompanied (this would not be the case if they travel with their family) and take them to the airport at the end of term.

International families should liaise with the host family beforehand to arrange a suitable day for arrival and departure of the student.

12. MONITORING ISSUES AND RAISING CONCERNS

The Head will monitor any issues raised, identify particular patterns or trends, decide if changes in welfare practices are needed, and take action as appropriate by informing the COO.
