### **PASTOR'S COLUMN**

Dear Parish Family,

The last two weeks of Lent are traditionally known as Passiontide—the Season of the Lord's Passion. Of course, on Palm Sunday we will hear the reading of the entire account of Christ's Passion, but already on the fifth Sunday of Lent there is allusion to the Lord's suffering (in the Year A readings we encounter death in the person of Lazarus, in the Year B readings Jesus alludes to the kind of death He would suffer).

One noteworthy tradition of the end of Lent is the veiling of crosses and statues, which seems to have begun in the 13th century. Thanks to local seamstress, Patty Jane, our parish will be able to partake of the practice. There are a few reasons for veiling these beautiful images. First, before 1970 the gospel of the fifth Sunday of Lent ended with John 8:59, "So they took up stones to throw at him; but Jesus hid himself, and went out of the temple." We are reminded of the time immediately before the Lord's solemn entry into Jerusalem when Jesus was out of public view so as to delay his crucifixion in order that it would coincide with the Passover. Since Jesus hid himself before Passover, we hide His image until Good Friday. Secondly, veiling images represents a final Lenten discipline. On Ash Wednesday we gave up the word, "Al\*\*\*\*\*a" in the Liturgy. Now, we deprive ourselves of the consoling images of the Lord, the Angels, and Saints. Like all fasting, we give good things up to receive them again in a new healthy way. Just think how lovely it will be to see everything again on Easter; it will be like encountering our Church for the first time. Finally, the veils remind us of shrouds. As we remember that the Lord's suffering and death is near, we are invited to enter more fully into the complete experience of the mystery of His suffering, death, and burial. I hope this final practice before Holy Week is edifying for your prayer.

By the time this bulletin is in your hands, God willing, I will be in Ireland to attend the first profession of vows of my younger brother, Brother Bernard Maria McMahon at Silverstream Priory, County Meath. I regret that the wonderful occasion calls me away from the parish so shortly before Holy Week, and causes me to miss our patronal feast St. Joseph's Day, March 19. Please know of my sincere wish to celebrate with you all. I will offer Mass for all of our parishioners—living and dead—on March 19 at the monastery.

Please do me the honor of attending the special feast day Mass at 6:30pm and enjoying all the delights of the potluck dinner that follows! I will be very happy to know as many parishioners attended as possible and joyful fellowship was had by all! This weekend and on St. Joseph's Day you will be in the capable hands of my dear friend and classmate, Fr. John Horan of Bishop McNamara High School in Kankakee. Fr. John is a great priest; I am so grateful he is willing to preside over this weekend's Masses and our feast day. Also, Fr. Alex Lorang, a fellow Homer Glen-ian, will celebrate St. Joseph's Day Mass for our grade school.

### SAINTS MARTHA, MARY & LAZARUS

Martha, Mary and their brother Lazarus were evidently close friends of Jesus. He came to their home simply as a welcomed

guest, rather than as one celebrating the conversion of a sinner like Zacchaeus or one unceremoniously received by a suspicious Pharisee. The sisters felt free to call on Jesus at their brother's death, even though a return to Judea at that time seemed to spell almost certain death.

Martha's great glory is her simple and strong statement of faith in Jesus after her brother's death. "Jesus told her, 'I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?' She said to him, 'Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world'" (John 11:25-27).

No doubt Martha was an active sort of person. On one occasion, she prepares the meal for Jesus and possibly his fellow guests and forthrightly states the obvious: All hands should pitch in to help with the dinner. The Lord recognizes that Martha is "worried about many things," also noting that Mary, who has spent the preparation time at Jesus' feet listening to his words "has chosen the better part." John 12:1-8 describes Mary's anointing of Jesus' feet at Bethany, an act which he praised highly.

Immediately after we are told that the chief priests plotted to kill Lazarus "because many of the Jews were turning away and believing in Jesus because of him." Lazarus was the one of whom the Jews said, "See how much he loved him." In their sight Jesus raised his friend Lazarus from the dead.

Legends abound about the life of Lazarus after the death and resurrection of Jesus. He is supposed to have left a written account of what he saw in the next world before he was called back to life. Some say he followed Peter into Syria. Another story is that despite being put into a leaking boat by the Jews at Jaffa, he, his sisters, and others landed safely in Cyprus. There he died peacefully after serving as bishop for 30 years.

It is certain there was early devotion to the saint. Around the year 390, the pilgrim lady Etheria talks of the procession that took place on the Saturday before Palm Sunday at the tomb where Lazarus had been raised from the dead. In the West, Passion Sunday was called *Dominica de Lazaro*, and Augustine tells us that in Africa the Gospel of the raising of Lazarus was read at the office of Palm Sunday.

### Reflection

In its 2021 decree on combining veneration of Mary and Lazarus with Martha, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Sacraments said, "In the household of Bethany, the Lord Jesus experienced the family spirit and friendship of Martha, Mary and Lazarus, and for this reason the Gospel of John states that he loved them. Martha generously offered him hospitality, Mary listened attentively to his words and Lazarus promptly emerged from the tomb at the command of the one who humiliated death."


The weekend will help your soul find a voice and transform the pain of the past into love and hope.



Saint Patrick was born in England, but when he was a teenager, he was captured by Irish pirates who took him to Ireland as a slave. After six years, Saint Patrick escaped and returned to England and his family.

When Saint Patrick became a priest, he traveled back to Ireland as a missionary so that he could teach the people about God. He used examples to explain the mysteries of the faith in simple ways. One day, Saint Patrick compared the Trinity to a shamrock. He said that the shamrock has three leaves, but it is only one plant. In the same way, God is three persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—but one God—the three leaves stand for the three beings of God, and the stem shows how they are united into one.

God used Saint Patrick's kidnapping to convert the Irish people. In our lives, God uses the bad times to bring about a good we do not always see. We must be patient and trust Him.




