PASTOR'S COLUMN

"We have never even heard that there is a Holy Spirit." Acts 19:2

Dear Parish Family,

The verse above always makes me laugh-out-loud and then sigh whenever I read it. In context, St. Paul is on one of his missionary journeys and passes through the city of Ephesus. There he stumbles upon some disciples. In the process of examining their catechesis, he asks them if they had received the Holy Spirit. Their response is both amusing and frustrating. How can one be a disciple and not know...um...God?

At the center of the Christian faith is the revelation that the one God is a Trinity of persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It turns out that these disciples had only participated in the baptism of John the Baptist. I imagine St. Paul was so excited to find a few believers in a city which until then had not been evangelized only to "facepalm" realizing he was basically starting from scratch. Paul proceeds to administer the Christian sacraments of Baptism (Acts 19:5) and Confirmation (Acts 19:6); the change in the disciples is immediate.

What makes me sigh after reading this account is the knowledge that after 2,000 years not much is different in God's Holy Church. When speaking with Catholics both young and old, so often one can ascertain that they have "never even heard of the Holy Spirit" for all practical purposes. Let us hear of the Holy Spirit's power and how it comes to us in Confirmation. The most common statement I hear about the effect of the Sacrament of Confirmation is that upon receiving it one "becomes an adult in the Church." I confess that I am a passionate dude, but few misunderstandings are more exasperating to me.

Simply put, that most widely held belief is <u>utterly false</u>. Where in the world does it come from? Who keeps teaching it? If it's you, please, cease and desist; I'm beggin' ya! Did you know that confirmation may be administered validly to a baptized Catholic of any age? Only two generations ago, children between the ages of 7-9 were routinely confirmed. Even today, the official protocol of Christian initiation states that if a child over the age of 7 is baptized, they should be immediately confirmed after Baptism. The Eastern Churches (Catholic and Orthodox) confirm infants immediately after baptism. Even in our Roman Church if there is a dangerous situation, infants may be confirmed. Are these little ones, therefore, adults in the Church? Absolutely not!

The prudential desire in ordinary circumstances to delay confirmation until one's teenage years in the Roman Catholic Church is not intended to signify that the sacrament is a religious coming of age ceremony (i.e. a Catholic Bar-Mitzvah). Confirmation is about the reception of the grace of the Holy Spirit for the purpose of engaging in the Christian life in an outward, external way. Let us hear from the Angelic Doctor, St. Thomas Aquinas: "For in Baptism [one] receives power to do those things which pertain to [one's] own salvation, forasmuch as [one] lives to [oneself]: whereas in Confirmation [one] receives power to do those things which pertain to the spiritual combat with the enemies of the Faith." (Summa III Q. 72). The "enemies of the faith" are the fallenness of the world, disordered attachment to the desire of fleshy/material things, and the Devil. We also sum up these enemies as temptation toward power, pleasure, honor, and wealth in a way

contrary to love of God. To live Christian holiness is not only to persevere unconquered against these foes. More so, in the life of every Saint we witness that the gift of the Holy Spirit elevates human capacity to make of Christians victors over these enemies in Jesus Christ.

Please keep all of the newly confirmed listed on the front of this bulletin in your prayers. May we all know the Holy Spirit to a depth which not only preserves us for salvation, but empowers us to become agents of Christ's own triumph in our lives.

SPIRITUAL KNOWLEDGE FROM WITHIN

"Why are you troubled? And why do questions arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. Touch me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have."

-Luke 24:38-39

Imagine if Jesus appeared to you. What if He showed you the wounds in His hands and feet and invited you to touch Him so as to believe. Would you believe? Most likely you would, to a certain extent. It would be the beginning of an experience that could be lifechanging, just as it was for these disciples. Our Lord's appearance to the disciples led to their transformation from men who were confused and doubtful to men who were filled with joy and zeal. Eventually, they would go forth preaching about Jesus as witnesses to His death and Resurrection with courage and with a desire that all who heard them would turn to Jesus as their Savior.

In the first reading of today's Mass, Saint Peter is recorded as doing this very thing. After healing a crippled man at the gate of the Temple, a crowd gathered in amazement and Peter preached to them about Jesus. He concluded His sermon by saying, "God has thus brought to fulfillment what he had announced beforehand through the mouth of all the prophets, that his Christ would suffer. Repent, therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be wiped away."


Today, we are entrusted with the same mission given to our Lord's disciples, and we must preach with the same zeal, courage and conviction with which they preached. First, we must become as certain as they were about Jesus' triumph over sin and death. We must turn from all sin and believe that the fullness of life is found only in Christ Jesus. But then we must commit ourselves to the proclamation of this faith with every fiber of our being.

Begin by considering how deeply you believe in Jesus as the Savior of the World. Though it might be tempting to think that having Jesus appear to you in person would help deepen your faith in Him, the truth is that the first disciples were not primarily convinced because of the physical appearances of Jesus. Rather, this gift came primarily through the spiritual touching of their minds. After appearing to the disciples physically, we read that Jesus "opened their minds to understand the Scriptures." This was what convinced them more than anything—the spiritual gift of understanding. And that gift is offered to you today, just as it was to the first followers of Jesus.


Saint Thomas Aquinas explains that the spiritual gift of understanding is a gift that reveals to us the very essence of God. He explains that it is a much deeper form of knowledge than that which is obtained through our five senses. Thus, simply seeing something with our eyes, touching it or hearing it is not nearly as convincing as the knowledge obtained through the spiritual gift of understanding. The gift of understanding enables us to "read inwardly" and to penetrate the very essence of something. For that reason, the physical appearance of Jesus might have been the first step toward believing, but it wasn't until these same disciples encountered our Lord within their souls, perceiving the very essence of His Resurrection inwardly, that they were forever changed. Only this form of knowledge could then convince them to go forth and proclaim the message of salvation.

Reflect, today, upon your own knowledge of Jesus and the transforming power of His Resurrection in your life. Has God spoken to you within the depths of your soul? Have you perceived this inward knowledge and had your mind opened? Listen attentively to our Lord—not just with your ears but primarily with your spirit. It is there, within you, that you, like the first disciples, will come to know and believe in the life, death and resurrection of Christ so that you can then go forth empowered to proclaim these truths to others.
