Dear Members and Friends of The Presbyterian Church,

What does it mean to be “blessed”? Whether we are using it as a #hashtag after a celebration or joy or modeling the classic instruction to “count our blessings,” our lives are meant to reflect a gratitude and appreciation for the things we have received. Often, naming these as “blessings” helps us not take the things or experiences in our life for granted. In our biblical texts, the word in Greek is *makarios*, which some translations render as “happy.” But to be blessed is about more than just a positive emotional response. Blessing is a spiritual response to the goodness of God. It is an acknowledgement that the source of all good gifts is God, who invites us to respond in faith.

This month, we will reflect together about what it means not just to be blessed, but to **“be a blessing.”** One of the ways we do this together as a church community is through the offering of our time, talents, and treasures.
