City Cemetery Dedication

1000 Washington Avenue, Fredericksburg, VA

The Presbyterian Church plot is to the left of the entrance, halfway down on the left side.

In January of 1844, a group of nine men gathered in the study of Rev. George W. McPhail, pastor of The Presbyterian Church, to discuss "a cemetery for the burial of the dead." That night, they decided to purchase an old field of corn along the "New Turnpike" (what we now know as William Street); three acres for \$550. The new town cemetery was born – a place "for the decent interment of the dead." The committee worked quickly over the coming months, laying out the lots, petitioning for incorporation, clearing rotting cornstalks, sowing grass, and completing a brick wall and gate. The corporation reserved the four lots around the center point "for the exclusive use" of the pastors (and their families) of the four major churches in town: St. George's, Methodist, Baptist, and Presbyterian. The Presbyterian Church plot became the final resting place for several former pastors, their family members and a prominent Presbyterian missionary who served in Brazil. Over the years, the church's knowledge and connections were lost but were renewed in 2023 at the request of Rev. Al Moreau, a Presbyterian pastor who was affiliated with the church in his retirement. The Property Committee, City Cemetery Work Group, and Memorial Garden Committee worked with members and leaders on the Session to develop a plan for the renewed use of this resource, expanding the eligibility to reflect the priesthood of all believers, available to members of the church, their immediate family, and others as approved.



A memorial monument featuring a Celtic cross was designed to foster reflection and provide space for the listing of names of those who have been interred. Generous gifts from within and beyond our community have provided the funds needed to bring this project to completion, and the monument was installed in May 2025. This afternoon, we give thanks to God for this sacred space and those who find their final rest here, within the city of Fredericksburg and close to the church we love.
