RESPONDING TO GOD'S WORD

Affirmation of Faith from *The Confession of 1967* (inclusive language text)
Biblical visions and images of the rule of Christ, such as a heavenly city, the household of God, a new heaven and earth, a marriage feast, and an unending day culminate in the image of the kingdom. The kingdom represents God's triumph over all that resists the divine will and disrupts God's creation.
