The Food Pantry Needs You!

Many in our congregation will remember when our church hosted a food pantry in the basement of the Parlor Building. During the pandemic, the pantry closed and our church combined resources with Fredericksburg United Methodist Church. Today, the FUMC pantry is still a vital part of our community's outreach to those who are hungry. It serves not only boxes of shelf-stable food, but also meat, milk and sometimes cheese and even produce. Several Presbyterians continue to support the FUMC Pantry through their financial donations and volunteerism. The need for volunteers and financial support is greater today than ever before! The Pantry's primary food source is the Fredericksburg Food Bank and those supplies are limited. At the same time, the Pantry is serving more families than ever. In October alone, 414 guests, representing 1,090 household members, visited the pantry. The pantry is open Tuesdays and Thursdays, 2-4 and Saturdays,10-12. Typically, three volunteers are needed for each shift (56 people a month). There are also numerous other volunteers needed at other times to prepare the food boxes. Some tasks are perfect for families. The FUMC pantry welcomes new volunteers and will train them. A description of each position is found in Sign-Up Genius.
