

## Greenworks Ministry - Green Tip for the Week

Don't Lose Your Cool - remember these tips during hot weather!

This past week has been really warm, so here are a few reminders on how to keep your home a bit cooler. They're pretty obvious, but sometimes we forget to do the obvious!

- Open your windows during the early morning and late evening
- Use fans to circulate air and make it feel cooler.
- Ensure your ceiling fans are rotating counter-clockwise to push air downwards.
- Use the microwave, slow cooker, or grill outdoors instead of the oven.
- Wash clothes and dishes during cooler times of the day.
- Unplug electronics and appliances when not in use, as they can still consume energy and generate heat.
- Close curtains and blinds during the hottest parts of the day to block out sunlight.
- Switch to LED light bulbs, which produce less heat and use less energy than traditional bulbs.

Maybe best of all, remember that the average date of first frost in the Champlain Valley is October 11, less than two months away!!!
