

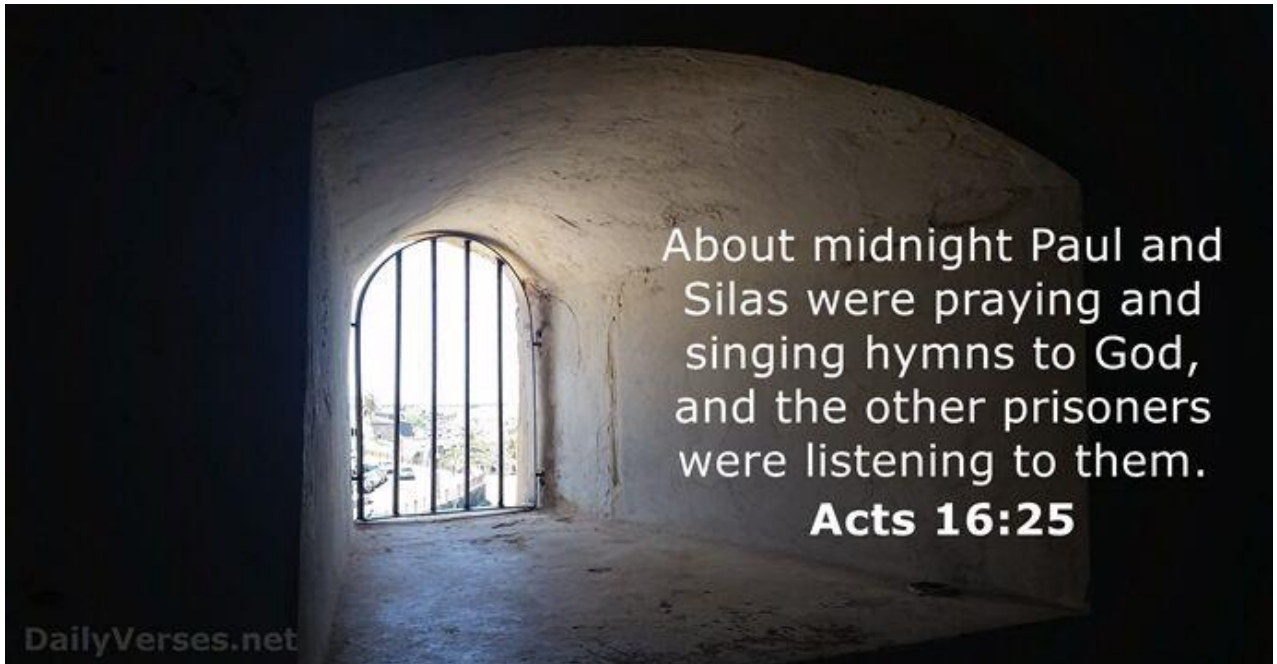

We are blessed with guests flutists today. [Sebby Wayman](#) of our congregation, is son of Katherine and Michael Wayman and brother of Jonah Wayman. Sebby takes flute lessons from our other guest flutist today, Karen Kevra. [Karen Kevra](#) is a Grammy nominated flutist who has performed throughout the United States, Canada, and Europe including performances at Carnegie Hall, the French Embassy in Washington, DC, and on French National Television. She has shared the stage with members of the Emerson String Quartet, the Paris Piano Trio, Borromeo String Quartet, Boston Chamber Music Society, and Trey Anastasio of Phish. Karen is the founder and artistic director of Capital City Concerts, the 25-year-old celebrated concert series in Montpelier, and is the creator and host of the *Muse Mentors* podcast, and *Flute Stories*, a podcast which integrates story-telling, sound effects, and her own performances of the rich solo flute repertoire. Karen teaches flute in Williston and at Middlebury College.
