# Greenworks Ministry – Green Tip for the Week

Frost Advisory!

Vermont has just had its first frost advisory for the season, which is a reminder to prepare our homes for winter.

It's a great time to check and replace your furnace filters and have your furnace serviced to ensure that it's running smoothly.

Time to reverse ceiling fans so they turn clockwise at a low speed, this will gently push warm air down into the room.

You might want to apply heavy-duty, clear plastic film to window frames to reduce drafts.
