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A Note about the Time with Children

We are delighted to welcome children into our worship service! And we have a special time during the service aimed especially at the youngest among us—and the young at heart! Remember that the worship service is being live streamed to social media. 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## **Greenworks Ministry – Green Tip for the Week**

Conserving water: Water conservation measures involve practical steps to reduce water use at home and outdoors. Key actions include fixing leaky pipes, taking shorter showers, running full

loads in dishwashers and washing machines, and installing low-flow or dual-flush plumbing fixtures.

Here are some suggestions for conserving water in the kitchen:

- Run the dishwasher and washing machine only with full loads.
- Keep a pitcher of cold water in the fridge instead of running the tap.
- Wash fruits and vegetables in a basin of water rather than under a running tap.
- Scrape plates instead of rinsing them before loading the dishwasher.
- Dishwashers work best when the water is hot before the cycle begins. But if you are going to run the water from the kitchen faucet until it is hot, I suggest collecting it in a gallon jug such as an old milk jug. Sometimes I can collect up to a gallon of water before the water gets hot. Then I save and use the water later to water my plants or use for other projects. It also saves on the water bill!

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Opportunities For Service

Are you feeling energetic? Need to get some more steps in? Do you feel the desire to serve this church, but can't make another long-term commitment?
