Greenworks Ministry – Green Tip for the Week

REDUCE, RE-USE, RECYCLE...AND TRY REPAIR

A pair of jeans with a small hole, a pull in a knit shirt or sweater, a small hole in a sock... Usually, these items are replaced by new versions that will wear or break in the same way. Many could have been saved with a simple repair. Fixing things yourself isn't just about pinching pennies. It's a refusal to treat everything as disposable.

For example, a stuck zipper can often be fixed easily using items you probably have at hand. First, check for caught fabric. The most usual cause of zipper malfunction is a thread or bit of lining caught in the teeth. Work it free with tweezers or needle-nose pliers. Don't yank, or you may tear the fabric or bend the teeth. |

If the zipper moves but won't stay closed, the slider has stretched. Squeeze the top and bottom (not the sides) gently with pliers to narrow the gap. Work gradually, testing after each squeeze. For a slider that's completely stuck, try rubbing the tip of a Number 2 pencil along both sides of the teeth, then work the slider.

These efforts don't always work. You may need a new zipper or even new pants, but it's worth a try!
