### **Greenworks Ministry – Green Tip for the Week**

Electric vehicles (EVs) still save you money even with the Federal rebates gone. First, Efficiency Vermont, your power company and dealers are offering rebates for both new and used EV's and home chargers. EV's are still cheaper than a gasoline powered car, over the car's lifetime, due to lower maintenance costs and electricity being much cheaper than gasoline. The war in Iran, with no end in sight, means gasoline has risen from an average \$3.06 to \$3.72 per gallon in Vermont. Even if the war ends tomorrow, it will be a while before gasoline prices return to pre-war levels.

The best deals are for used EV's. A five-year-old EV's battery retains 95% of their charging abilities, and is a lot cheaper than new. Remember most people charge their batteries at home overnight. Chargers can be installed in garages or even just outside your home.

Beware of offers of \$10,000 off for some new EV's by some car dealerships. Often these are tied to taking out a loan at a high interest rate that means more than half of the "rebate" gets used up by paying that high interest rate. Do the math it may be better to get a 0% loan without this kind of dealer "rebate".



Trustee and Greenworks Ministry Update on grant applications

We have now received \$5,000 from Vt Interfaith Power and Light toward our new air source heat pumps in Fellowship Hall. This new grant, combined with the \$7,500 we received earlier from Efficiency Vermont, means we covered most of the cost of the new heat pumps with grants. Trustees will thus have more funds for the many other projects they are working on. We have received all three grants we applied for, plus the free weatherization for the Mace House in 2025 and 2026.

We have now come to the culmination of the Season of Lent, a time of contemplation and prayer as we prepare for Easter. The *following resources are suggested by the Education Committee.*
