### **Greenworks Ministry – Green Tip for the Week**

2026 is a banner year to find a used EV. 215,000-300,000 leases will end this year—double the number for 2025. And in 2027 the number of leases ending double again!. A three-year-old EV is a great deal as prices have dropped 40% and this brings them to within \$1,300 of similar used gasoline car. But remember EV's save money over their lifetime over a gasoline car. The standard Vt. electricity being about the same as \$1.75-\$2.00 per gallon of gasoline for the same milage. But often electric utilities offer an off peak rate. This is \$.60 per gallon of gas for Burlington Electric and \$1.20 for Green Mountain Power. EV's have a lot less maintenance as well. EVs often are programmed to help you find a charging station. Once you learn how to use them, even on long road trips the car directs you to a charging station when you need it. Most of the time you are charging at home at night. Remember there are still rebates through your electric utility for both EV's and home chargers.
