


Friday Morning Centering Prayer Group

Do you have 2-4 hours to transform a low-income neighbor's life?

Three non-profits are cooperating to help low-income Vermonters get the free weatherization they qualify for. United Methodist Volunteers in Mission, the Champlain Valley Office of Economic Opportunity (CVOEO), and 350Vt are in partnership to provide volunteers to help cut the two year wait time.

Volunteers work the days/times that work for their schedule. We move items out of attics and three feet from basement walls. Most items are less than 5 lbs. Our help frees up the skilled weatherization crews to do their magic and not waste time on moving stuff.

CVOEO data shows homeowners go on to save up to \$1,000 a year—that alone is life transforming. But there is more: the weatherized home is more comfortable year-round, safer, healthier, worth more, and we reduce air pollution, and greenhouse gasses.

The Missions and Social Concerns Committee will once again sponsor a community-wide Food Drive on **Saturday, November 15**, in the **church parking lot from 9-11am** for families in the Williston Schools and the Williston Food Shelf areas.

We are blessed to have a very diverse community! As such, we have learned that providing food for Thanksgiving and the school break needs to be diverse as well. Donations of **gift cards** from Hannaford and Shaws so that families can purchase food items they may need and be more familiar with are very much appreciated. Gift cards may be placed in the offering plates through Sunday the 16th, mailed to the church or delivered to the drive on the 15th.

We encourage food donations for breakfast, lunch and snack foods, to supplement the families' dietary needs. These include the following items:

Canned fruit, vegetables, fish or chicken, soups/stews, cereal, peanut butter/jelly/jam, pasta/sauce, macaroni and cheese, granola bars, juice -- juice boxes or 2 liter bottles—condiments (ketchup, mayo, mustard), personal care items-including feminine hygiene products, pet food, laundry detergent.

We ask that you simply give what you can. Thank you for your generous spirit and support of this important community outreach project.

If you wish to contribute, but are unable to participate on Saturday, November 15, you may leave your food donation in the boxes on the table outside Fellowship Hall.
