Today the Church celebrates the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome, the oldest and highest ranking of the four major basilicas in Rome. This feast became a universal celebration to honor the archbasilica, the ecclesiastical mother church, called "the mother and mistress of all churches of Rome and the world" (omnium urbis et orbis ecclesiarum mater et caput), as a sign of love for and union with the See of Peter.

During the month of November we especially remember the people in our lives who have died. We are invited to pray for them and have Masses offered at the parish, if further purification is needed, as is the case for every person, before they are able to enjoy the vision of God. A verse from the hymn "Lord Jesus, Think on Me" expresses this thought well:

From the Pastor's desk

Every November, our church turns its focus toward the deep mystery of death and the great hope of eternal life. The month begins with the Solemnity of All Saints' Day, where we celebrate the countless souls who now share in the glory of heaven, and continues with All Souls' Day, when we pray for everyone who has died, especially those being purified by God's mercy. We are invited this month to remember our beloved dead, to visit their graves, to offer Masses for them, and to renew our own faith in the Resurrection. While the experience of losing a loved one wounds the human heart and leaves a profound emptiness, we look to Christ for comfort. Jesus Himself wept at the tomb of Lazarus, showing compassion, but His tears were not tears of despair.

In raising Lazarus, and through His own Resurrection, Christ reveals that death does not have the last word. He promised, "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live" (John 11:25). As this month unfolds, I invite you to make three simple acts of faith: First, pray for the dead. Offer Masses and prayers for your loved ones, remembering that the bonds of love are purified and strengthened in eternity. Second, accompany the dying. Visit the sick and the dying, comfort the lonely, and advocate for care that upholds the dignity of each person until natural death. Third, reflect on your own life. Ask yourself if you are living in readiness for eternal life and if heaven is truly your ultimate home.

In praying for the dead, we are reminded of our shared destiny: eternal life with God. In our mourning, we find hope; in remembering, our faith is renewed. Death, illuminated by the light of Christ, becomes not the final word, but the threshold to glory. As St. John Paul II wrote, "The believer knows that his life is in the hands of God and that death is the door through which he passes to the embrace of the Father." May this November be for all of us a time of sincere prayer, reflection, and renewed trust in the promise of eternal life. Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen.


