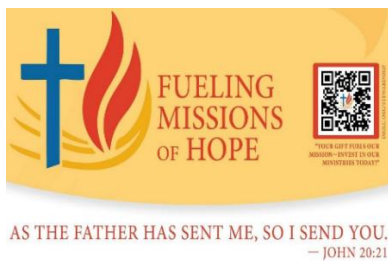
From the Pastor's Desk

250 Hours of Adoration and 250 Works of Mercy

On **June 11, 2026**, the bishops of the United States will consecrate our nation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus as our country prepares to mark the 250th Anniversary.

To consecrate something is to entrust it to God, to place it under His care and set it apart for His holy purpose. In this national act of prayer, the Church will ask Christ to pour His

mercy, healing and love upon our country.

At a time when many people are carrying loneliness, anxiety, division and spiritual weariness, this consecration invites us to return to the Heart that never stops loving.

What does “consecration” mean?

Consecration is not simply asking God to bless what already belongs to us. It is placing ourselves, our homes, our communities and our nation more completely in His hands.

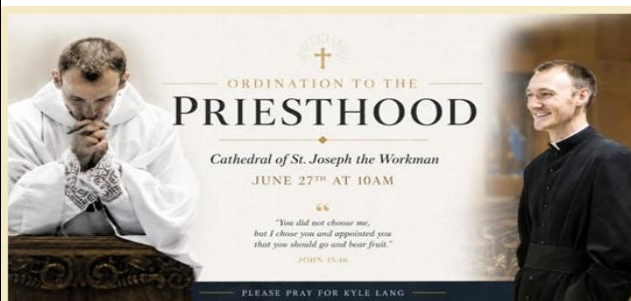
As Pope Benedict XVI explained, to consecrate something or someone is to give that person or thing to God, so that it no longer belongs merely to our plans, our fears or our control, but to Him.

On June 11, Catholics across the country are invited to pray with the Church and entrust our nation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Parishes can participate in 250 hours of adoration together by offering a Holy Hour on a weekly or monthly basis leading up to the July 4 anniversary. Parishes and communities can decide how best to set up their holy hours, continue current practices, or invite new people to join.

While 250 hours seems like a lot, each person present constitutes an hour prayed. Parishes and communities can also consider how to incorporate both the 250 Works of Mercy alongside the 250 Hours of Adoration.
